



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

November 12, 1946.

Re: Naosuke AIHOSHI, Reg. No. 00550

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 18, 1942.

On June 16, 1942, he handed this office a list of chattels, which he stated had been rented at \$5.00 a month to Mr. L. Sims, tenant at 655 East Cordova. Commencing in August, 1942, this office received 13 payments of \$5.00 for the rental of these effects through Pemberton Realty, who charged 25 cents a month commission. Net credit to AIHOSHI from these payments was \$61.75. In August, 1943, the last payment from Mr. L. Sims was received. On December 9, 1944, Mr. Sims informed this office that the agreement made with AIHOSHI was to purchase these goods for a total of \$70.00, payable \$5.00 monthly. This information was passed on to AIHOSHI for his comments on December 11, 1944, but no reply was received from AIHOSHI. It is assumed therefore that the statement made by Mr. Sims is correct. It would seem that one payment of \$5.00 must have been made to AIHOSHI, if the total sum of \$70.00 was paid by Sims.

On March 31, 1944, two bundles of pictures, two trunks, one bundle of golf clubs, 4 cartons of effects and two boxes of effects, stored at 992 Powell Street were shipped through the BCC Security Commission. These goods were not declared by AIHOSHI in his original declaration, and presumably had been stored at 992 Powell by AIHOSHI himself before his evacuation.

On September 26, 1944, AIHOSHI inquired about some goods in the attic of 655 East Cordova, naming a suitcase full of pictures in particular. Neither this file nor that of the owner of the premises (File 1550) indicate that any goods identified as belonging to AIHOSHI were removed from 655 East Cordova.

A radio surrendered by AIHOSHI was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$1.50, which has been credited to his account.

The account of AIHOSHI has been credited with \$15.00 as refund of security deposit for light received from the B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd.

On June 16, 1942 a list of furniture which had been rented at \$5.00 a month to L. Sims, 655 E. Cordova, was made up. This list signed by Sims is on file, and shows the items listed on this page.

From August, 1942 to August, 1943 payments of \$5.00 were made each month by Mr. L. Simstrough Pemberton Realty Corp Ltd. Commission of 25 cents a month was charged by the realty company.

On December 9, 1944, Mr. L. Sims signed a letter stating that the arrangement made with AIHOSHI was to purchase the furniture for \$70.00 payable at \$5.00 a month. On December 11, 1944, we informed AIHOSHI of Mr. Sims statement, and asked him to inform us if the statement was incorrect. We received no reply.

Total payments made through the Custodian by Sims were \$65.00; apparently one payment of \$5.00 must have been made to AIHOSHI, if the total purchase price was paid.

With reference to your request for information in regard to the funds standing to your credit with this office, we wish to inform you that these funds are derived from the following sources:

Thirteen payments of \$5.00 each were made by Mr. L. Sims in connection with the purchase of your furniture. The real estate company who handled the collection of these payments charged 25 cents a month for this work. The total amount paid by Mr. Sims was \$65.00. The expenses were \$3.25, leaving a net amount of \$61.75, which was credited to your account.

The sum of \$15.00 was received from the British Columbia Electric Railway Company as refund of security deposit for light.

The net proceeds from the sale of your radio was \$1.30.

Your account was credited with the sum of \$9.50 in full settlement of the claim filed by you against Mr. Kanpei OSUMI.

Your account was credited with the sum of \$6.50 in full settlement of the claim filed by you against Mr. Asataro TAKASAKI.
