Dear Sir:-

In regard to shipment of articles owned by the Japanese evacuees formerly living in the strategic areas, I am informed and have read in the Province News and in an edition of the Paper, the New Canadian, that sewing machines and small stoves were shipped free of charge to interior towns. This probably applies only to those moving in to "Ghost Towns" and not to self-supporting families, so am therefore making this enquiry.

The last of my personal effects left at Otter Bay, Port Washington, is a small kitchen range, also left in Mr. Cousineau's charge. I now wish to have that stove shipped. In which case the free shipment does not apply to us and we be fully responsible for all charges I am willing to pay all necessary charges.

I will write Mr. Cousineau immediately but am enclosing an addressed envelope herewith, requesting you to write briefly to Mr. Cousineau, informing whether the charges must be paid by us or not. I would like you to forward that information to Mr. Cousineau as he takes charge of all our shipments from Otter Bay to Vancouver.
