C. As far as I can gather the confusion was caused by the mention of two distinct persons in your letter of August 10th, 1942. The reference to Nanaimo Shipyards had to do with Yokichi FURUMOTO, P.O. Box 367, Nanaimo, B. C., refund \$4.29, for which you have received a cheque. I hope that this explanation will clear up the matter for you and regret that you were unduly inconvenienced.
