GENERAL MEMORANDUM

October 24, 1945.

Re: Tomiso BANDO, Reg. 02421
A Sada (Mrs. Tomiso) BANDO

These two files and Files 3764, 14723 and 386, which are the files of Kiso, Yoshio and Toshio, sons of these persons, have been reviewed, and the only property of any kind revealed is that dealt with in File 396.

None of this family, except Toshio BANDO, File 396, declared any property of any kind, and while it appears probable that the chattels dealt with in File 396 may have been the property of the family, the net proceeds of the sale of the chattels remaining, after shipments had been made by Mr. A. H. Young to Toshio BANDO, at Moscow, amounted to only \$19.02, and Toshio BANDO upon being advised of the sale asked that the proceeds be remitted to himself.

In view of the fact that the sum involved is small and that no other member of this family has at any time declared ownership of any of the chattels, we are forwarding to Toshio BANDO the proceeds from the sale of the chattels as he requested in his letter undated, received September 7, 1945.

The above memorandum is certified to be in accordance with information revealed on the files referred to herein.

We assume no responsibility for anything stored in this building. Between the date of evacuation and the date we removed the chattels, shipments were made by Mr. IWASAKI on his visit to Vancouver and also by Mr. A. H. Young, who held the keys to this building. I have made this quite clear to Mr. Young, who agrees, and mentioned that he had written to Mr. IWASAKI disclaiming responsibility for any chattels that may or may not have been left stored in this building.
