Neither husband, Katsuei Adachi, nor his wife declared any personal property, though there is a second registration dated September 8th, 1942 by the wife giving particulars of certain articles sold and taken away; also said that "the remainder of her furniture, which was registered on May 20th, will be left at the above address", being 1635 West 2nd. This must refer to the declaration made by the father, Shikaichi Adachi, file 9625.

Messrs. Ker & Ker on the husband's file 11676, in their report of June 3rd, 1942 under name Shikaichi Adachi, make a reference to articles shown on the "JP" form and recommend that they all be placed in one room. They also mention three stoves and a number of articles stored for Yoshimatsu Sumi, our file 8576. These were later moved under his name as per inventory #193 of December 17th, 1942 on his file, at the same time as Katsuei Adachi's were moved.

Prior to this, the premises had evidently been left vacant (undated report of Mr. Trumbull on file 9676) and burglarized -- see memorandum of December 5th, 1942 on file 11676.

What remained of Katsuei Adachi's (or perhaps more correctly Shikaichi Adachi's, the father, as it was he who made the declaration) was moved as per list #196 dated December 17th, 1942 on his file. This list was referred to Katsuei Adachi on January 4th, 1943 and mention was made that we presumed these were Mr. Sumi's belongings as none had been declared by Katsuei Adachi. This, of course, was an error and Katsuei Adachi so replied on January 15th.

Everything that could be found on these premises has now been moved as per inventory #196 referred to above and the

With reference to your property at 1635 West 2nd Avenue, we have to advise that same has been condemned by the City of Vancouver Health Department, and as it has been found quite impossible to get anybody to take the place over and put it in a habitable condition for renting purposes, we have had no alternative but to arrange for the building on these premises to be boarded up, which kindly note.

As a matter of fact, the Health Department, when writing us recently on this matter, recommended that the place be demolished. It may be that later on the Building Department of the City of Vancouver will insist on this building being demolished, and if so, we shall have to have this done. If there are any proceeds after wrecking charges have been paid, same will be credited to your account.
