3 Baskets effects, 1 Trycyle, 2 Bdl clothing, 1 tool box,
3 bx effects, 1 crtd stove top, 1 bx personal effects.

There is no further mention of personal chattels belonging to this Japanese on file.

BOAT:

Yakichi OYE, according to Vessel Report on file states that he was the owner of the "Garry Point VI" and was sold on April 10, 1942, and the proceeds paid to him on April 16, 1942.

We have now been in communication with two
individuals in connection with this claim. First, Yaichi
Oye, Registration No. 05241, Previous address:- P. O. Box 28,
Steveston, B. C. On contacting him the first time he replied
on the lines shown in our letter to you of May 6th, 1943. We
wrote him again and he replied, in part, as follows:-

"As I wrote to you the other day, I bought a machine
about 7 or 8 years ago and sent to my wife in Japan. I
have paid by monthly instalment to the agent, Shuzo
Tsuruda in about one year time, and I owe nothing to the
company nor their agent at all. You judge this case with
your common sense, if I owe anything they might claim me
since but they didn't do so until you wrote to me.

"It must be something wrong, therefore you tell the
company better ask this agent Shuzo TSURUDA who is
Sandon now."

We also tried Yakichi OYE, Registration No.
05543, Previous address:- Garry Point, Box 268, Steveston,
B. C., and he replied that there must be some mistake as he
was not buying a sewing machine.

We ~~doubtless~~ wish to assist you to get this
business cleared up but although the first man we contacted
would appear to be the right party, we cannot release the
machine until we are satisfied we have contacted the right
party.

OVER

We therefore think you had better get more complete information from the agent who sold the machine. He ought to be able to supply you with all the particulars about the purchaser. His full name, his registration number, if possible, his approximate age, address before evacuation and, if possible, his present address also his occupation. If you can supply the above information to us we will make another attempt to locate the buyer. Should it turn out that the buyer is the above named Yatch OXF we will send you a release for the machine immediately.
