

Replying to your letter of February 16th, 1950 Mr. and Mrs. Yoshie Yasura and their son not daughter Minora returned to Japan on August 2nd, 1946. Any payments for these three Japanese should be forwarded to the Custodian of Enemy Property, Vancouver for their respective accounts.

These persons are all indebted to the Canadian Government for advances made to them when they returned to Japan and any money received for them is applied on their indebtedness. After payment of their respective debts the surplus is then turned over to the Dominion Government Treasury Office for remittance to them in Japan.

Yoshiharu Yasura is still in Canada, he left Fort William in May 1946 for Rays, Ontario where he worked for the Pigeon Lumber Company. This is the last known address of this Japanese.

Since, however, Ontario is nearly 3000 miles away from Vancouver we are of the opinion that one of your Ontario offices would be able to locate the Pigeon Lumber Company.


