



On receipt of the declaration properly completed, we shall give our further attention to the matter.

DECLARATION AS TO LOSS OF RADIO RECEIPT

CANADA) IN THE MATTER OF a receipt for radio

BRITISH COLUMBIA) Street, Vancouver, B.C. Housewife.

TO WIT:

I, Mitsuko YAMASHITA of Slocan, B.C., Housewife do solemnly declare:

1. That I owned a General Electric radio, Model KZ-70, Serial No. 861 and have personal knowledge of the facts herein declared.
2. That I had in my possession and control at 756 E. Cordova St. a radio as above described.
3. On the 12th day of March, 1942, I delivered the said radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.
4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt in all repositories where such receipt might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipt has been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.
5. That I have not in any way dealt with the said receipt or papers relating to the said radio and have not pledged or hypothecated the same or lodged the receipt with any person, firm or corporation as security.
6. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.
7. That I have been informed that my radio has been sold for the sum of \$65.00 net.
8. That I, Mitsuko YAMASHITA, the owner, am therefore now entitled to the proceeds of such sale, amounting to \$65.00 net.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.

Dear Madam:-

We are in receipt of your letter of the 12th instant in which you request that we forward to you the net proceeds of the sale of your radio. This we are now doing, and are forwarding to you, through the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, our cheque for \$65.00, which is the entire balance on hand to your credit on the books of the Custodian.

In your Declaration of the 21st May, 1942, you did not declare any assets or liabilities. Later, however, we received from the R.C.M.P. a radio which they had obtained from you on the 12th of March, 1942, under your Registration No. 00892. This came into our possession on the 27th January, 1944 and was sold for \$75.00. From this amount the following items of expense were deducted:

Auctioneer's fee	-	\$7.50
Advertising	-	1.88
Moving	-	.62
		<u>\$10.00</u>

leaving a balance of \$65.00 as previously referred to in this letter.

In your letter of the 12th instant you returned a declaration of lost Radio Receipt, duly completed, as required by this office, thereby enabling us to release these funds.

As there were no other assets of yours that came under the control of the Custodian, it would appear that the foregoing accounts for all the property of every kind, left by you in the Protected Area, which vested in the Custodian.

In order that you may confirm this, and acknowledge the cheque, when received, we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
