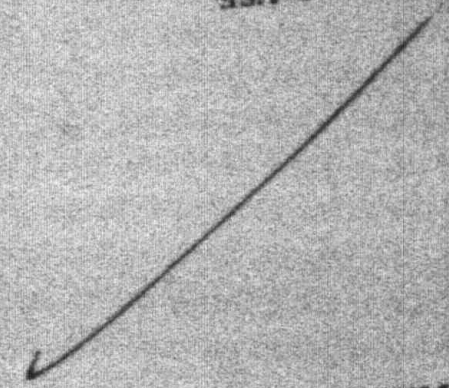

The deceased declared no assets to the Custodian and none are revealed on the file other than a refund of \$8.00 from the B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd., being refund of Security Deposit for light.

A claim was filed against the Estate of the deceased for the sum of \$80.00 to cover funeral expenses paid by the B. C. Security Commission. Our cheque for \$8.00, being total amount at credit of the Estate in this office, has today been forwarded to the Department of Labour to apply against this claim.


We wish to make claim for recovery of the sum of \$80.00, representing the cost of funeral expenses paid by this Commission in connection with burial of the above deceased.
