June 26th, 1943.

From: Mr. Green.

Re: SHINTANI, Yutaka and
SHINTANI, Irene Aiko.

Mr. Yutaka Shintani declared only nets, but on April 28th the investigating agent declared a few items in charge of the wife. She did not register until May 22nd and was not evacuated until July at the earliest. As she declared nothing and as she sold at least some of her husband's nets, it may be assumed that she either took with her or disposed of the other belongings. Some may, however, have been stored in the Celtic Cannery where they will doubtless come to light when shipments reduce the congestion here and permit of an inventory being taken.
