PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 9917

Re: TSUJI, Tokichi.

CHATELS: The above registered on May 22, 1942 and was evacuated in September 1942.

He declared on a J. card, no property. On September 23, 1943 we received a Custodian release calling for shipment of 1 carton and 4 boxes clothing, tools and kitchenware from the Buddhist Temple at 1684 West 1st. Ave., Vancouver. This building was ransacked by thieves and contents of boxes strewn over the floor and we were never able to determine what was stolen. Our Mr. Logan took an inventory of anything that could be identified prior to the break in, and discovered the undermentioned in the name of Tokichi TSUJI:

- 1 Wheelbarrow
- 1 Small shrine
- 1 Basket
- 1 Large carton
- 1 Galvanized tank
- 1 Large tin
- 1 Japanese Tub.

Mr. TSUJI was advised on November 12, 1943 of our inability to recover and ship any of his belongings.

No other assets were declared.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.



Neither this Japanese nor his wife declared anything to the Custodian but the former applied for some boxes left at 1684 First Avenue West. Mr. Spain's letter of November 12th covers the position which remains unchanged. The writer saw these premises directly after they were ransacked and the identification of the contents is very difficult. In the absence of further information from the Japanese, it is difficult to see what can be done.

We have your letter of the 6th instant with reference to carpenters tools and clothing said to have been stored in the Buddhist Temple at 1684 West 1st, Avenue, Vancouver.

We very much regret having to advise you that thieves broke into this property and all the boxes were ransacked.

It is impossible to determine what was stolen, but as the contents of the boxes were strewn over the floor, we could not restore them to their original containers.

We will be obliged to hold the clothing etc. until such time as conditions enable us to establish ownership.
