GENERAL SUMMARY

RE: Mary MIZUHARA, Reg. No. 07954

Mary MIZUHARA made her declaration to the Custodian on May 26/42 and was evacuated on Sept. 5/42. She declared only \$7.00 in War Savings stamps and these were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

Her file was originally credited with proceeds from sale of some books, but as she had not declared any and her mother had, these funds have been transferred to the account of the mother, File 10451.

There are no claims on this file.

There is a letter on file from a Mrs. Williams, 475 N. Garden Drive, Vancouver, stating that she shipped the following to M. MIZUHARA at New Denver, B.C.

2 wooden boxes - chinaware  
2 cartons, books and magazines  
one small carton - electric fixtures  
one cardboard box, Xmas decorations

As she was a young unmarried girl living at home, it is more than likely that these boxes and cartons are part of the 15 boxes declared by her mother. All chattels are dealt with on file of mother, File 10451.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file. The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

You will recall that Mr. Spain had some correspondence with you in October last year. He has since contacted Mr. Hem and reported the disposition of various effects. Some have been delivered to Mrs. Blackburn at the request of the owner and some taken to 992 Powell St. for disposal by auction.

This leaves certain items in the care of Mr. Hem, some missing, and some said to belong to the Canada Mio Company not available for inspection. We know that you have great confidence in Mr. Hem and that he was a personal friend of Joe Mizuhara, but the writer is not altogether satisfied that everything is as it should be. You might let us have a full report on this at your convenience (there is no particular urgency) and in this connection, we should like to know about the equipment of the Canada Mio Company as it appears not impossible that sooner or later this Company may be vested.

I have for acknowledgment your letter of the 26th inst., requesting me to arrange for the removal of certain chattels situated in the premises of the Canada Mio Co. Building.

With regard to List No. 1 in your letter I have requested Mr. Peter Hem, tenant of the building, to make mutually satisfactory arrangements with your Department for access to the property for the removal of these chattels.

With regard to the first six items of the second list, I am also requesting Mr. Hem to make these available for your removal.

With regard to the last six items of the second list, I have to point out that these do not, under any stretch of the imagination, come under the control of Mrs. Mizuhara. These chattels and/or equipment are the property of the Canada Mio Co. which is a limited stock company. Your sale of these articles for her account would certainly result unfortunately for your office. Title to these chattels as property of a limited company does not vest in the Custodian.

On several occasions the writer has pointed out to Mr. Spain that it would be advisable for him, before taking any steps or issuing any instructions in connection with property and/or businesses in relation to which I am acting as your Agent, to discuss the matter verbally with myself or Mr. Messenger. Acting in the capacity mentioned I am naturally more fully informed as to the situation than is possible for your office in handling such a tremendous number of files at one time.
