Remarks: Amount claimed from the Insurance Company and paid by them to B. G. Packers Limited covering fishing nets was as stated above - \$1100.00. B. G. Packers Limited' cheque to this office amounted to \$950.00 after deducting \$50.00 owed to them by S. Yamasaki and \$100.00 by S. Yamamoto.

The amount claimed and paid by the Insurance Company to cover the loss of lumber to S. Oikawa was as shown above - \$249.71. Cheque paid to this office by B. G. Packers amounted to \$277.23 after deducting \$12.48, being 5% for handling charges.

The money covering these claims has been credited to the various Japanese accounts as listed above.

We the undersigned, had a set of Cohoe net each stored at Wadahams Cannery, subsidy of the B. C. Packers Limited, located at Wadhams, B. C. Which has been duly registered with the Custodian in Vancouver, prior to our evacuation, along with other articles, namely, 5 H.P. Palmer engine net lines and other things.

According to the information received from a friend at Wadhams, B. C., all of the above mentioned stored goods were destroyed by fire of last summer when the cannery got burnt down.

These Cohoe nets has been insured at \$100.00 each against fire losses, on October 3rd 1941.

Your advise as to what step we should take in order to collect this insurance, would be greatly appreciated. As we were unable to get any reply from the B. C. Packers Limited in this connection.
