In March 1944 we had some correspondence with you in connection with four claims filed against you by O. Kondo & Co., H. Ebisuzaki & Co., B. C. Electric Co. and Maikawa Ltd. You admitted all the claims and stated that you had an understanding with Maikawa Ltd. that the claim would stand until the end of the War. The first three claims were settled at that time.

A claim in the amount of \$1.21 was filed by KOMEYA Co. (Mr. Ji-chiro MORISHITA) against your wife. She admitted the claim but likewise stated that she had an understanding with Mr. MORISHITA that the claim would be paid after the end of the War.

Your credit balance with this office is of \$250.20, derived from the sale of your radio, car and some Judo Mats which Mr. Yoshikazu NISHIMURA, of the Home Buddhists' Association, stated belonged to you. This will be sufficient to settle both claims on a pro rata basis of 93% as follows:

To enable us to release the funds derived from the sale of your radio, it will be necessary for you to forward the receipt the R. C. M. P. gave you when you surrendered your radio. Should you be unable to locate this receipt, please complete and return to us the attached declaration.

We feel confident that your creditors will accept this pro rata settlement as full payment of your claim and trust to hear from you in this connection without delay.
