PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: IyeTATEISHI, Reg. No. 05370

This woman is the wife of Tamesuke, File 9866, former owner of the premises at 3203 West 10th, Vancouver, B. C. Prior to his evacuation, Mr. TATEISHI appointed Mr. Homer J. Moore as his agent to look after his house. The house was rented by Mr. Moore up to the time, in November, 1944, when the property was sold by the Custodian.

Mrs. TATEISHI signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 27, 1942. She was evacuated on May 28, 1942. The only property declared by Mrs. TATEISHI were chattels which she said would be left at 3203 West 10th, and the key to the premises given to Mr. Moore.

The first reference on file to any investigation of the chattels by this office is a memorandum dated June 12, 1943, in which it is stated that there was a locked room at 3203 West 10th, to which Mr. Moore was reported to have the key. It was assumed that the chattels declared were in this room. The property was sold by the Custodian in November, 1944, and on November 14, 1944, a memorandum regarding the chattels was placed on file. This memorandum states that the tenant had reported that the following chattels had been purchased by her and that payment had been made to Mr. Moore:

6 Chairs  
1 Bed

1 Chest of Drawers  
A Quantity of Wood

By memorandum of December 7, 1944, it is reported that several truck loads of effects were removed from 3203 West 10th, including all reported by Mrs. TATEISHI and not otherwise disposed of. Of the goods removed the articles discarded are listed on memorandum of December 1, 1942, signed by W.G. Willard, auctioneer. All goods removed from the house and carrying no identification were considered to be the property of Mrs. TATEISHI and when sold the proceeds were credited to her account.

*November 30/44*  
The auction sales of December 7, 1944 and December 14, 1944, account for everything declared by Mrs. TATEISHI (and not sold by her or discarded by the Custodian) except for one desk. It is possible that this desk was sold as a stand, a cabinet or something else. There are quite a number of articles shown in the auctions and in the list of goods discarded that were not declared by Mrs. TATEISHI.

Copies of the auction sheets of goods credited to Mrs. TATEISHI were sent to Mr. TATEISHI on January 2, 1946, in reply to an inquiry received from him regarding his furniture and the furniture of his friend Mr. HEIKE, as well as a pressing machine belonging to a Mr. Yamamoto. We informed him that any goods removed from 3203 West 10th, which had not carried other identification, had been considered to be the property of Mrs. TATEISHI, and asked him to identify from the auction sheets any goods that had been left in his house by his friends.

Mr. TATEISHI's reply was received on February 25, 1945. It is not entirely clear, but we have interpreted it to mean that any goods found marked with the name of Mr. HEIKE was the property of Mr. HEIKE, and that, in addition, the bedspring shown in the auction sheets was the property of Mr. HEIKE. We have therefore transferred to the account of Muneharu HEIKE, File 7525, the proceeds from the sale of a Slumber King spring which had been credited to Mrs. TATEISHI. The account of Muneharu HEIKE had already been credited with the proceeds of the sale of the articles identified as his property.



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 10111- continued

In his letter of February 25, 1946, Mr. TATEISHI refers to a pressing machine belonging to Mr. YAMAMOTO. We asked him who Mr. YAMAMOTO was, but received no reply. A pressing machine was found at 3203 West 10th, but this was identified as the property of Mrs. Kiyoko OKANO, File 1346, who had reported leaving this machine and some other articles in these premises. The proceeds of this sale were credited to Mrs. OKANO.

Goods, mainly gardening equipment, identified as the property of Shigeru TATEISHI, brother of Tomesuke TATEISHI, were found at 3203 West 10th, and when sold were credited to his account. Shigeru TATEISHI inquired about a bicycle which he stated he had left at these premises, but as the bicycle had carried no identification and had therefore been considered to belong to Mrs. TATEISHI, we, Tomesuke and Shigeru TATEISHI informing them of this and asked them to communicate with each other and then inform us of their wishes in regard to any goods wrongly credited. We have received no reply, and have left the bicycle to the credit of Mrs. TATEISHI.

Mr. TATEISHI in letter received February 25, 1946, stated that he had been unable to find the following articles on the auction sheets:

1 Garden Roller  
1 Office Desk

2 Pair Swivel (?) desk chairs

We have no record whatever of the garden roller, and this roller had not been reported to this office by anyone prior to February 25, 1946. The desk probably was the one declared by his wife, and this could have been sold and called something else in the auction. If not the desk is missing. In regard to the chairs, apparently six chairs were sold to the tenant, eight chairs were sold at auction, only six chairs were declared by Mrs. TATEISHI.

The sum of \$1.61 was received from Mr. Homer J. Moore, and was the balance of the purchase price of the goods sold to the tenants, less Mr. Moore's commission of 5%.

In view of the complaint received from the Health Dept. regarding the basement, we removed the entire contents of the locked room and found therein, several truck loads of chattels - among them the articles declared in your memorandum of the 14th ultimo.

All of these articles have been sold at Willards auction room.

There is no evidence of rats, and if there is anything of an unsanitary nature in the basement, I would suggest that this is due to the fact that Mrs. Little keeps a dog locked up in the basement.

I would further suggest sending Mrs. Little a treatise on hygiene and sanitation.

On April 12, 1946, we wrote to Mr. Tateishi informing him of the articles which had been found at 3203 West 10th identified with the name of Mr. Shigaru Tateishi. At that time we informed both Mr. Tomosuke Tateishi and Mr. Shigaru Tateishi that a bicycle found at 3203 West 10th without any identification had been sold and the proceeds of the sale credited to Mrs. Iye Tateishi. As we have received no word from the persons to whom we wrote, we have assumed that Mr. Shigaru Tateishi has no objection to the proceeds from the sale of this bicycle being sent to Mrs. Iye Tateishi.
