in Japan) loaned to Yanado Shiota Etsu
(now in Hastings Park), the sum of \$430.00
(Promissory Notes dated August 22, 1923,
bearing interest @ 8% were produced as
evidence).

He requests us to collect this
debt, and pay the money to him as he will
be in an internment Camp, and unable to do
so himself.

The fact that his father left
the promissory notes with him before return-
ing to Japan suggests that the father had
expected the son to collect the debt.



Attached you will find copies of letters from Mr. Spain dated July 23rd and 29th regarding the individual mentioned above whom we understand is interned or is about to be interned.

The promissory notes mentioned are also attached and Receipt No. 117 covering them was handed to Mr. Kobayakawa, the copy of the receipt for Mr. Noble being attached also.

This appears to be a case of a claim made by a local Japanese for re-payment of money loaned to Mr. Enta by said local Jap's father who is now in Japan.

We are writing to Mr. Enta and should Mr. Enta acknowledge his obligation and send us the amount which may or may not be due either in part or in full, we will so notify you and at that time have the money credited to the account of Mr. I. Kobayakawa, enemy, in Japan.

Angler Internment Camp, Angler, Ontario.

Upon your release, you will proceed directly to Gravel, Ontario, by Canadian Pacific Railway and will report yourself to Mr. C. A. Gardner at Gravel, Ontario, as follows: Immediately on your arrival and will enter his employment in accordance with your agreement so to do.

The following are herewith delivered to you:

- (1) Haversack rations sufficient for your journey to your destination.
- (2) Copies of all Undertakings signed by you as conditions of your release.
- (3) All effects delivered by you to any officer or soldier of any camp or station in which you have been held, with the exception of such articles as have been previously returned to you or as have been noted as missing on Form I.O. 10 "Inventory of Prisoner's Effects".
- (4) The balance of all funds held in trust for you by the Camp Commandant.
- (5) Second-class transportation from Angler to Gravel, Ontario, by Canadian Pacific Railway will be provided.

You are hereby warned to register yourself as required by the National Registration Act at the Post Office in the vicinity of your place of residence.

In reviewing file No. 10117 - Hideo KOBAYAKAWA, Registration No. 00458, we find the above claim lodged against Eizo KOBAYAKAWA. The record shows Eizo KOBAYAKAWA to be the father of Hideo, and now living in Japan.

On August 3rd, 1942 there is a memo from your Department regarding these Japanese. It would appear that Eizo and I. are one and the same. I am, therefore, forwarding this claim for your Internee File No. 993 and removing it from file No. 10117.
