Sold through our agent H. Campbell for the sum of \$225.00 less his commission of 10%, leaving a net sales price of \$202.50 credited to account of MORI. Appraisal fee of \$5.00 deducted from MORI's acct.

These items were appraised by Thompson and Company for the sum of \$275.25. Campbell's offered to buy all of these items at the appraised price with the exception of the electric sewing machine which had been appraised at \$100.00. It was therefore decided to sell all the goods with the exception of the sewing machine to Campbell Bros. for the appraised sum of \$175.25 and sell the sewing machine separately at auction. We received the sum of \$175.25 from Campbell Bros. and this sum was credited to the account of MORI. Appraisal fee of \$5.50 was paid to Thompson & Co. from funds standing to the credit of MORI.

- electric sewing machine sold at auction on Feb. 14/45 for the net sum of \$60.46 and this sum credited to account of MORI.

All of the above items were originally leased to Campbell Bros. for the sum of \$10.00 per month. A total of \$239.50 less Mr. Campbell's commission of \$10.00 collected for rent of this equipment prior to its sale. This was a net of \$229.50 which was credited to the account of MORI.

Chattels: The dry cleaning equipment declared at 1001 Denman St., Vancouver, by Mrs. MORI, was rented to Campbell Bros., dry cleaners, through our agents H.D. Campbell, for a monthly rental of \$10.00. At the termination of the lease all of the equipment was sold to Campbell Bros. on the basis of our appraisal by Thompson & Co. as per Chattel Schedule on file, with the following exceptions.

The Hoffman Press, boiler and equipment was sold to the Army for the net sum of \$202.50 and this sum credited to the account of Mr. MORI, File 9745.

The electric sewing machine was removed to Custodian ware house and sold at auction for the net sum of \$60.46, and this sum credited to the account of Mr. MORI, File 9745.

Alot of undeclared and unlisted personal property at 1001 and 1005 Denman St. was disclosed by Kyumatsu MORI in his letter of March 22/45 at which time he requested shipment of the following:

The B.C.S.C. in their letter of May 2/45 expressed disapproval of shipment of anything except purely personal goods. A shipment of 1 box of personal effects and a crate of screens was made to MORI at New Denver on May 29/45. Most of the other articles asked for in his letter were sold at auction as noted on Chattel Schedule. The total net amount received from auctions was \$134.57, not including the \$60.46 received from sale of the sewing machine at auction.

The amount received from counter and showcases sold to Campbell Bros. was \$175.25.

The amount received from Campbell Bros. for rent of the equipment was \$239.50, less the commission of 5% paid to our agent H.D. Campbell..

Two cheques, one for \$30.00 and one for \$500.00 were sent to Mrs. MORI from the account of Mr. MORI. An account of \$8.36 was paid to the B.C. Telephone Co. from this account and also back income tax owing by Mr. MORI in the sum of \$48.55 was paid from his credit balance with the Custodian. The cost to have the press appraised was \$5.00 and this was paid from the account of the above, and the cost for shipping personal goods to him was \$8.10, which sum was also deducted from his account.

SHARE

The above declared one share in Associated Dry cleaners and Dyers. A letter from W.A. Jacklin & Co. dated June 5/42 states the number of shares owned by the above in this company was 9. This security did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The above declared a savings account in the Royal Bank of Canada, Georgia and Denman Sts., in the sum of \$300.00. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Three policies were declared, one with the Yorkshire Company in the sum of \$3000.00, one with the Monarch Life in the sum of \$1000.00, and two with the Sun Life Co. each for \$2000.00. In his letter of July 3/46 MORI requested us to pay the Sun Life Co. the sum of \$639.74 in order to bring his account up to date. In his letter of July 31/46 Mr MORI requested us to pay the Monarch Life Co. the sum of \$81.70 to bring this account up to date. As he has only a balance of \$646.77, both of these accounts cannot be paid.

The following claims have been filed against Mr. MORI:

1. Mr. Campbell advised us in a supplementary report to his original that he had found out that MORI owed 6 months rent on the premises at 1001-1003 Dumas St. However in his letter of July 15/43, our agent, Mr. Campbell stated that Mr. MORI had settled this claim.
2. The P. C. Telephone Co. filed a claim against Lucky Chambers, 1074 Dumas St. This had been owned by MORI and he asked us to pay this claim of \$5.36 in his letter of Oct. 3/43. It was paid on Oct. 22/43 from funds standing to his credit with this office.
3. The P. C. Telephone Co. also filed a claim against H. MORI trading as MORI Chambers in the sum of \$3.55. Mori advised us that he had sold this business to Teutsum NITAHARA and this claim was paid by NITAHARA on July 26/43.
4. Bean Products of Eastern Canada Ltd. filed a claim against H. MORI, together with G. KIMORI in the sum of \$46.42. It was finally found out that this claim should have been against Lucky Chambers 1074 Dumas St., which had been purchased by Teutsum MORI from Hyumatsu MORI. It was settled by Teutsum MORI for the sum of \$49.22.
5. A claim was filed against MORI by the Income Tax Department in the sum of \$48.55. This was paid by the Custodian on Feb. 14/44 from funds standing to the credit of MORI.

Thank you for your letter of February 20th in answer to which we are giving you the following information.

Mrs. Mori's account has been credited with the sum of \$120.73 being proceeds of sale of radios as per enclosed particulars. This money can be sent to her subject to the approval of the B. C. Security Commission Supervisor at your end and on receipt by this office of the R.C.M.P. Receipt handed to her at the time the radios were turned over.

Turning to Mr. Mori's account, we see that on November 12th, 1943, we sent you a statement showing a credit balance of \$96.14 less cheque for \$50.00 = \$46.14. Since that time, the following transactions have occurred.

In November 1943, Messrs. Campbell Brothers advised that they were no longer using the press and boiler belonging to the Denman Cleaners and this was sold to the Army at the ceiling price shown below on August 23rd, 1944.

Messrs. Campbell Brothers continued paying rent until May 1944 being the date at which they wished to discontinue the use of the equipment. It was then decided that in accordance with the Government's policy of liquidation, the remaining effects should be disposed of. It was felt that a better price could be obtained from Messrs. Campbell Brothers than from outsiders as a number of the items were such as not to be worth moving.
