Mr. Hajiro Takimoto, Police Registration No. 10772, has forwarded an copy of his letter to you dated July 23rd indicating desire that a permit be granted to him and to his daughter, Mitsuye Takimoto, Police Registration No. 10768, to enter the protected area temporarily for the purpose of clearing up with you certain aspects of his affairs.

If you are of the opinion that the return of the two individuals in question for a specific number of days to Vancouver would be of material assistance to you as his solicitors for the purpose mentioned above, it would be appropriate for you to file application on behalf of your client and on behalf of the daughter of your client with Mr. E. A. Eastwood of the B. C. Security Commission, 360 Howe Street, Vancouver, and when doing so, you have our authorization to inform the B. C. Security Commission that the Custodian voices no objection to the temporary return of the two individuals in question for the purposes indicated. As solicitors for Mr. Hajiro Takimoto, you are in a much better position than the Custodian to judge whether or not the temporary return to Vancouver of Mr. Takimoto is desirable.

Re: Mrs. Mitsuyo ISHII #10668,  
(nee TAKIMOTO).

We are enclosing herewith R.C.M. Police Permit for the above-named Japanese, allowing her to proceed to VANCOUVER, accompanying her father, Mr. Yojiro Takimoto, #10672 as his secretary and interpreter in connection with the settlement of the affairs of the Fernridge Lumber company, owned by Mr. Takimoto, in consultation with the Custodian and with Mr. Allan Russell, Barrister, 850 - West Hastings Street, Vancouver.

They will travel at their own expense, and may stay in Vancouver for a period of four days, where they must report immediately upon their arrival to the R.C.M. Police at 360 - Homer Street, Vancouver. The route they will travel will be Stage to LYTTON; (stage does not run Mondays); thence C.P.R. or C.N.R. to Vancouver, returning the same way.

They will be responsible for all expenses they incur in Vancouver and during their trip, and must return to LILLOOET on or before expiry date on their permits.
