

Dear Sir:

With reference to your letter of March 27th, we wish to inform you that payment has been stopped on the cheque, payable to you, which was sent from this office in April, 1945, to you, but which you have not received.

As we note that you have stated that the sewing machine, from the sale of which the funds in your account were received, was the property of Mrs. Hana SUGA, we will be unable to send these funds to you without the consent of Mrs. SUGA. We are writing Mrs. SUGA today in regard to this.

Your file with this office shows that we were informed that the logging equipment, which you reported in your declaration to the Custodian, was removed by you before your evacuation from Suicide Creek. This information was passed on to you on June 26, 1942, and would appear to be correct as you did not reply to our letter.

The trunk which you had stored at 958 Brunette Street, New Westminster, was shipped to you in October, 1944.

The bank account reported by you to the Custodian did not come under the control of this office.

The sum of \$29.81 which was credited to your account from the sale of the sewing machine is being held until we hear from Mrs. Hana SUGA.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

April 5, 1946

Re: Yuki TAKIZAWA, Reg. No. 05146

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 27, 1942. He was evacuated on June 13, 1942.

In his declaration he reported logging equipment left in care of the manager of the Stave Cedar Co., Suicide Creek, B. C. On June 26, 1942, the manager of the Stave Lake Cedar Ltd. informed us that this equipment had been taken away by TAKIZAWA upon evacuation. On April 13, 1946, TAKIZAWA wrote us that this information was correct.

On August 15, 1944, TAKIZAWA signed a Custodian Release for one trunk and two suitcases containing clothing, which were stored at 958 Brunette Street, New Westminster. A trunk, containing two suitcases, was removed from 958 Brunette Street, in the presence of Dr. Sakae KUMAGAI, a member of the family that had resided at that address. This trunk was shipped to TAKIZAWA, who acknowledged receipt of the shipment on October 27, 1944.

On October 27, 1944, TAKIZAWA inquired about a sewing machine, belonging to a friend, which he had left at 958 Brunette St., New Westminster. This machine was sold for the net sum of \$29.81, which was credited to the account of TAKIZAWA. TAKIZAWA stated that this machine was the property of Mrs. Hana SUGA (File 10812); this woman informed us on April 12, 1946, that she had turned the machine over to TAKIZAWA in settlement of a debt, and she asked that the proceeds be paid to TAKIZAWA.

A cheque for \$29.81, which was requisitioned from the account of TAKIZAWA, on April 17, 1945, is unaccounted for. This cheque has not been cashed, TAKIZAWA states that he has not received it. Payment has been stopped and a duplicate cheque is being issued.

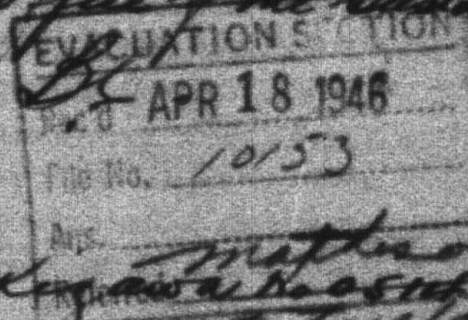
TAKIZAWA declared a bank account. This did not come under control of this office.
