TITLE The Trustees of the Steveston Congregation of the United Church of Canada. Vested. No. 24912.

At the time of registering title as above, the trustees were all persons of the Japanese race, but as trustees may change from time to time, there is not necessarily any Japanese interest in this property.

We are using this property for storage and paying Taxes and Insurance in lieu of rent. Subsequent to this rental arrangement, we rented a portion of the church for residential purposes and are obtaining rentals of \$23.00 monthly. In view of the small amount we are paying for the storage space, and due to the fact that when the United Church made arrangements with regard to the rental with the Custodian, they were under the impression that the premises would be used entirely for the storage of Japanese goods, it would seem only right that the rentals received by the Custodian should be remitted to the United Church of Canada.

Dear Sir:

Re: Steveston Japanese United Church

Replying to your letter of the 29th ult., in which you request the use of the United Church building (Japanese) at Steveston for the storage of personal effects of evacuated Japanese, I beg to reply as follows:-

It will be agreeable to the United Church of Canada for the building to be used for such storage purposes on the understanding that you take care of the taxes as from this date, and any repairs made necessary by the use of the building for storage purposes. I understand that you require the building only for the duration of the war and that when the war ends this agreement will terminate. I note that a nominal sum of \$1.00 rental is to be paid.

There is this further condition, that the personal effects of the former minister, Rev. K. Nomoto, which are now stored in the building will remain there in one of the rooms, and that the furnishings belonging to the Church will also have storage in the building. Further, it is understood that I shall have access to the building whenever it may be necessary, but before making any visit to the building I would communicate with you.

If you will draw up the necessary document, giving effect to the above agreement and conditions, and send it to me, I shall sign it and return it to you. Before taking over the building for your purposes, I would want to visit it along with your representative.

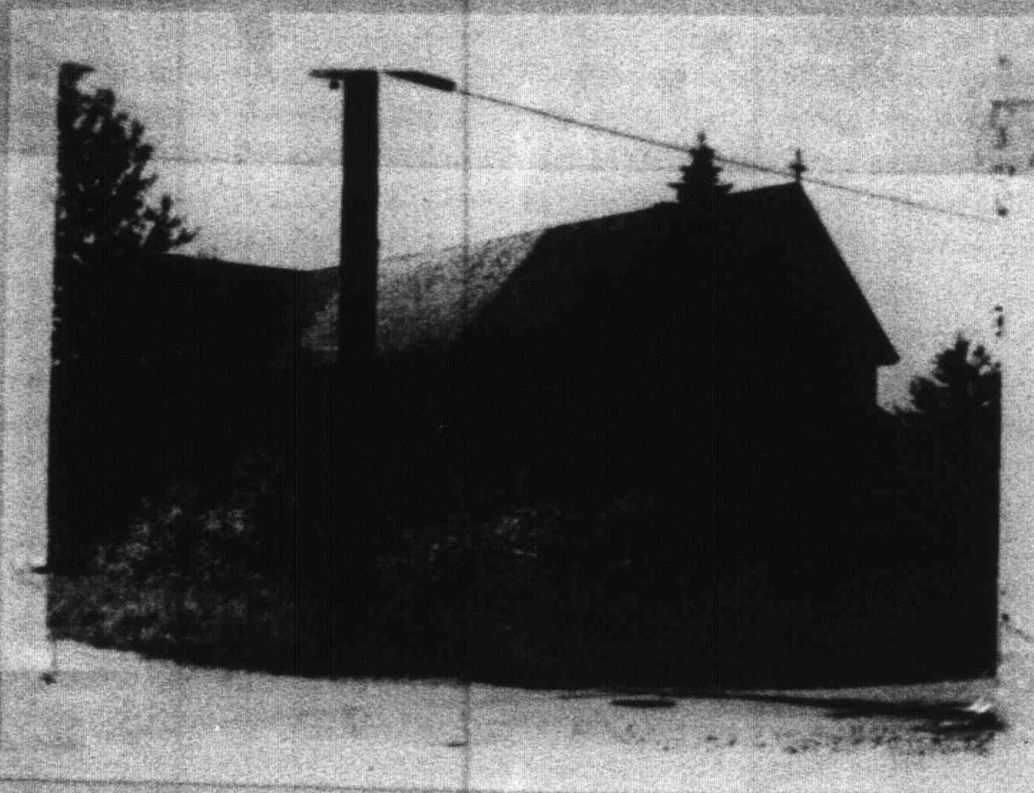

The first is lots 7, 8, & 9, Block 3 } all in Steveston
The second is lot 12 in Block 3 } same site

Block 3 is registered here in the Land Registry Office:

"Trustees of the Steveston Congregation of
the United Church of Canada".

The title to Property No. 2 was registered on March 21, 1939,
having been transferred on January 11, 1939 by "United Church of Canada"
to the trustees. (See letter from W. P. East dated January 11, 1943;
also letter from Richmond dated March 1st). The trustees in question
are Japanese. (See letter from W. P. East and from E. Maxwell; also from
East.)

Lot 12 is clearly a Japanese interest. The history of Lots 7,
8, & 9 in Block 3 does not appear on file, but the registration is in the
past tense and until the contrary is shown, I believe that we are entitled
to assume that no being since Japanese owned. It is true that in Mr.
East's letter of January 11th he says that there must have been a mistake.
The mistake is not mine. Mr. East knows the situation. It is his job, I
think, to prove to us that lots 7, 8 & 9 are not Japanese owned and/or
controlled. It is quite certain that on these stands the Japanese United
Church. The white congregation meets on another property. (L. H. 24, 24, 24, 24)

All papers relating to land are therefore being taken from
File No. 13542 and are being placed on No. 13543. 13542 is being re-
named "Japanese Congregation, Steveston United Church, Trustees of".

The check on lot 12 is being reported as running with the
land and title from 21 are being credited to 13543. Again is described
by Pacific as a purchaser accepting a check on the land and again's claim,
which was only very recently made, is not thought to be that of an owner
but merely that of a tenant-at-will. In any case, the check has no
legal effect. The money was being paid for the land which belongs to
the trustees.

Dear Sir:

RE: Estate of Kyuichi Nomoto, dec'd.

On July 6th, 1944 you were good enough to provide us with the Consent of the Custodian to the appointment of Kiku Nomoto as Administratrix of the above noted Estate and to the distribution of the Estate in accordance with the law of the Province of British Columbia. Since that time, as we advised you on the telephone recently, it has come to our attention that there exists an Order-in-Council of the Provincial Government which requires the express license of the Crown in the Right of the Province to the appointment of a National of an enemy country to act as Administrator of an Estate. The Minister of Finance has also advised that in no circumstances would he consent to a Japanese National being so appointed. Accordingly it will be necessary for us to apply for revocation of the Administration granted in this matter and to seek the consent of the Minister of Finance to have Letters of Administration granted to the Official Administrator for the County of Vancouver.

We presume that we are also obliged to clear the matter again with you and to ask for the consent of the Custodian to the appointment of the Official Administrator for the County of Vancouver as Administrator of this Estate and for distribution of the proceeds of the Estate in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia.

Part of the assets of the Estate which will require to be declared for succession duty purposes, as such, consists of a pension of \$80.00 per quarter

November 10th, 1944

payable to Mrs. Nomoto as widow of the deceased and \$1000.00 representing the proceeds of a life insurance policy with the Ministers' Life and Casualty Company held by the deceased which is payable to Mrs. Nomoto as the named beneficiary thereof. We are taking the position with the Minister of Finance and have no reason to believe that he will not concur therein, that for purposes of administration and distribution these two items do not constitute part of the assets of the estate and therefore, subject to your consent, may be paid over to Mrs. Nomoto. It would accordingly be appreciated if you would include in your letter specific mention of these items and consent to their payment if you deem the same necessary.
