Mrs. Same ARIMA (file 10335) in her JP form dated June 2, 1942, declared a \$1000.00 Mutual Life Insurance Policy naming her daughter, Takako, as beneficiary. Mrs. Same Arima died on August 3, 1944 and on writing to the daughter relative to this insurance (Sept. 28/44) she replied on October 5th, 1944, that this insurance had to be dropped as they were unable to continue with the monthly payments after evacuation.

NO OTHER PROPERTY OF ANY KIND WHATSOEVER BELONGING TO THE ABOVE JAPANESE PERSON IS REVEALED ON THIS FILE.

We wish to acknowledge your letter of September 22nd which has now been turned over to this Department for attention.

Please be advised that the above named has no money on deposit with the Custodian and no real property being administered here. Under these circumstances, we are not able to assist you in recovering the cost of funeral expenses as claimed in your letter mentioned above.

I understand there is a Sun Life Policy No. 2284904 which covers on the life of Yoshifumi ARIMA, son of the above named. This policy was taken out by the mother and now that she has died the title in the policy will fall to her estate. The Executors or Administrators may cash it in, or they may possibly transfer title to the son, the assured, who is now over 15 and legally able to look after it himself.

For your information, I will give you the following quotation from Sun Life letter of September 25th which may be of some value to you:

"First of all, it will be necessary to ascertain if Mrs. Arima left a Will. If she did, we will require a certified true copy of the Will and Probate. If she died intestate then, we will require a certified true copy of letters of administration. In addition to this, an official certificate of death will be necessary.

"We presume Mrs. Arima died in this province and if this is the case it will be necessary for her representative to furnish us with a Province of British

As far as we know, the only course open for receiving the money for funeral expenses would be through the Executors or Administrators of Mrs. ARINA's Estate.

On the F. F. Form completed by Mrs. ARINA on June 2nd, 1942, she declared a \$1000.00 Mutual Life Insurance Company policy naming her daughter, TANKO, as beneficiary. To date, we have no further information about this policy but when and if we are able to get any we will advise you.

Once the foregoing documents have been filed with us, then title to the policy will vest in her Executors or Administrators. They in turn can, if they wish, transfer title to Josephine Arina, the life assured. As he is now over fifteen years of age, he would be permitted to vest in the policy himself if and when title is transferred to him.

The amount of this Columbia Succession Duty Release. The amount of this release will be the net cash surrender value of the policy at the date of her death. Unfortunately, we have not a table of guaranteed values that apply in this policy so cannot quote the net cash surrender value at that time. We are, however, writing to our Head Office today for this information and as soon as it arrives it will be forwarded to you.

Your statement as to the assets and liabilities are correct insofar as information we have on file is concerned.

With reference to Western Mutual Policy No. 4319-5597, I have been in touch with that Association this morning and they advise the certificate which covered on the life of the above named was suspended for non-payment in October, 1942.

This lapsed certificate with the Western Mutual Benefit Association apparently is the life insurance referred to by Mrs. Arima on her J.P. Form as being the \$1,000.00 Mutual Life Insurance policy which was referred to in ours of September 28th and October 10th last. I checked up with the Mutual Life Insurance Company office and they had no record of any policy in force on Mrs. Arima's life.

We are certainly agreeable the suggestion that you handle this matter.

Our records reveal that a few months before she was evacuated your late mother declared some chattels as being stored at 8814 Selkirk Street, but when the goods were removed from the above address to public auction none were found marked with your mother's name, therefore everything was sold in the name of the owner of the house, Sentaro Suzuki, and the proceeds credited to his account.

On writing to Mr. Suzuki regarding chattels declared by your mother to have been left at the above address, a reply was received from his daughter, Aya, on November 12th, 1945 which reads as follows:

"Following are the list of things that the Arimas had in our place:

Dishes and glassware  
Bamboo Bookshelf  
Small chest of drawers  
Home made table  
3/4 bed Brown hollow posts

The last item I found in another page but it is confusing to know just what item fits the description they gave me, the other items we went over together as I was on a trip to Hamilton and so got in contact with them."

According to our records you are the oldest member of the family and we would therefore ask you to confirm if the above information given by Miss Suzuki is correct in order that the proceeds from their sale may be transferred to the correct account.

Your prompt attention to this matter will be appreciated and a stamped and addressed envelope is enclosed to facilitate your reply.
