

In reply to your letter of March 26, please be advised that I have completed the necessary forms required by you. Prior to my husband leaving for the work camp, he filled in the forms mentioned by you, at the Fuji Chop Suey, on Powell Street.

At the time this was done, all assets of my family were declared by my husband, and during my stay at Hastings Park, this was explained to the Custodian there, and so my registration card was stamped "Registered by Custodian".

As mentioned in your letter, if no property remaining in the protected area, this will serve as a notification of same.
