

If my interpretation of the Pacific Co-Operative Union's statement is correct, it seems that this truck was sold to R. Bouffard on June 30th, 1942, or previous to June 30th, 1942, under agreement for some specified amount in excess of \$479.47. The statement shows he made payments under our Truck Sales Agreement totaling that amount, then turned in the truck about Cotober 31st to the Pacific Co-Operative Union and received a credit of \$479.47 ocvering payments to date.
