This file reveals that Mrs. NISHIMURA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

Mrs. NISHIMURA made her declaration to the Custodian on June 9/42 and was evacuated on Sept. 8/42. She declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file, to be left in care of the tenant of 8738 Selkirk St. Mr. and Mrs. Uhei MIKE, father and mother of Mrs. NISHIMURA, were the owners of this property.

In a memo to file dated Nov. 3/42, Mr. Spain advises that no chattels were found at 8737 Selkirk St. in the name of "K. NISHIMURA". He stated that there was furniture in the name of "K. NISHIMURA" stored in the basement of 8837 Selkirk St.

Our inventory No. 565 on this file only indicates that a shrine, a basket, a carton and 2 trophy cups were removed from 8837 Selkirk St. in the name of K. NISHIMURA. However other articles sold and credited to NISHIMURA were likely removed from 8837 Selkirk St. with those of Mr. Akio FURUKAWA, File 2205, the owner of this property. Chattels were sold as shown on the Schedule for the net sum of \$21.12 and credited to the account of Mrs. NISHIMURA.

It is noted that the following goods declared by Mrs. NISHIMURA were not found by the Custodian:

Linoleum not declared by her, was sold in her name.

A shrine and 2 trophy cups were inventoried, but the file gives no indication as to what happened to them. It is possible they may still be in storage.

There is no explanation on the file as to how the goods which she declared at 8738 Selkirk St. happened to be moved to 8837 Selkirk St.

The file of Mr. Akio FURUKAWA has been checked and his money has all been remitted to him.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

CHATELS: Further to summary of December 4, 1946, Mrs. NISHIMURA has stated in letter of August 29, 1947 that any funds derived from the sale of chattels left at 8738 Selkirk, where she declared goods left with her parents, were to be sent to her parents Mr. & Mrs. Uhei MIIKE. We can therefore presume that any items listed in her J. P. Form which cannot be located (see schedule) were either taken by her between her declaration June 9, 1942 and her evacuation September 8, 1942, or sold with the goods of her parents.

Perhaps she moved some of her chattels to 8837 Selkirk as it appears possible. As noted in summary of December 4, 1946, some goods were sold by auction for the sum of \$21.12. This was transferred to Chattel Suspense Account on August 4, 1947 as Mrs. NISHIMURA had not replied to our letters in which we tried to identify the owner. We wrote to the owner of 8837 Selkirk Street, Mr. Akio FURUKAWA, File 2205, and he replied that K. NISHIMURA was Kinzaburo NISHIMURA and that we were to credit him whatever proceeds derived from the sale. As Kinzaburo's account is closed and in any case he declared no chattels, the sum of \$21.12 was re-transferred from Chattel Suspense Account to this file, on September 2, 1947.

The custom in the Vancouver Auctions was to move the goods to Auction, sort them and inventory only the goods which were considered personal goods. Later, in many cases these boxes were opened and the contents sold. No record of anything being sold after July 27, 1944 appears on file. Mr. Wills' inventory of goods stored at 604 East Cordova, taken as of February 20, 1947 lists 2 trophies, photos and 1 bdle of photos being held under file 15123, the husband's file. There is no record of what happened to the shrine and the basket and possibly some of the contents of the carton.

We are writing to Mrs. NISHIMURA to suggest that the few remaining items be shipped to her.

This woman declared goods left at 8738 Selkirk Street. Her husband declared no chattels. The goods sold and credited to the account of Mrs. NISHIMURA were removed from 8837 Selkirk Street, under the name "K.Nishimura". As there is no evidence that Mrs. NISHIMURA or her husband left any chattels at 8837 Selkirk Street, would you please transfer the goods sold at Vancouver Auctions Nos. 27 and 28, now credited to Mrs. Yochiyo NISHIMURA, to Chattel Suspense.

NOTE- Inventory 565 on file 10475 (copy on G/181) is a list of personal goods segregated when the goods were brought into the Warehouse, the other goods being sold by auction. The Inventory book gives Inventory 562 as that of FURUKAWA, Akio, File 2205 who owned 8837 Selkirk Street. It would appear then that the goods marked NISHIMURA, K. did come from that address and not from 8738 Selkirk Street as might have been the case. The Auction File reveals that goods from 8837 Selkirk St. were removed on July 5, 1944, a week before inventories 562 and 565 were made, while goods from 8738 were removed on July 24, 1947, at least that is the date of the bill. Obviously goods brought to the Warehouse on July 24 could not have been inventoried on the 12th. We are writing to FURUKAWA in an attempt to obtain the full name of K. NISHIMURA.

File 10475 reveals that goods sold in Auctions Vancouver 27 and 28 have been credited to that file. They were marked K. NISHIMURA and, as far as can be ascertained, came from 8837 Selkirk Street. This house was owned by FURUKAWA, Akio, File 2205. Mrs. Tachiyo NISHIMURA to whom the goods were credited lived at 8738 Selkirk Street where she declared having left chattels. The chattels sold agree partially with her declaration. As we cannot locate the chattels which she presumably stored at 8738 Selkirk Street, it is quite possible that she moved her belongings to 8837 Selkirk and did not advise us.

We are writing today to Akio FURUKAWA in order to obtain the full name of K. NISHIMURA.

We have today received authority from your daughter, Mrs. Wilmers,
and your son, Mr. E. Wilke, to release to you all funds derived from sale of
chattels removed from 6736 Selkirk Street and sold at public auction in your
name. Before forwarding to you these funds we still wish to know if any other
person besides the above-mentioned members of your family left goods along
with yours at the above address. If not, then we shall be in a position to
immediately forward to you the balance of funds in your joint account, namely
\$99.50, and also the small balance of \$1.34 in Mr. Wilke's single account.

Relative to that portion of your son's letter inquiring on your be-
half if any chattels still remain at 6736 Selkirk Street, we wish to advise
that when the real property was in course of sale all chattels were removed
from 6736 Selkirk Street and sold at auction in your name. The following goods,
however, were abandoned as they were found to have no salable value: 1 fish
net (rotten), 1 hose (rotten), 2 old chairs (broken), 2 old couches and garden
tools.

According to our last storage report there are two bundles of photos
belonging to you still at 604 Cordova Street, and we shall be glad to know what
disposition you wish made of these goods.
