A claim in the sum of \$90.00 was filed against Mrs. SUZUKI by Dr. E. J. Haig. Mrs. SUZUKI admitted this claim and requested that it be paid from sale of her household chattels, left in the care of the Custodian. On Sept. 13/44 we paid the sum of \$25.24 on this account, being the entire funds then standing to the credit of Mrs. SUZUKI with this office. At the same time we advised Woodworth & Woodworth Ltd. who were collecting this account for Dr. Haig, that we would take no further action in the collection of the balance of this account. We told them the position of Mrs. SUZUKI and her son, Susumi SUZUKI, who is a chronic invalid, suffering from tuberculosis of the bone.

The Department of Labour filed a claim against the estate of Mr. Tamesaburo, deceased, for funeral expenses. The sum of \$8.00 in the account of Mr. SUZUKI was paid to the Department of Labour on Dec. 2/46.

There are no other claims on file against Mrs. SUZUKI.

The above party shipped a large amount of household furniture and twelve boxes from here to Greenwood on which the freight was \$39.50. He has paid only \$15.00 and our Supervisor at Greenwood states he is destitute. The writer was given the information that this man had a large amount of money on his person when he left here. This man agreed to pay the freight charges. Had this not been so we would have forwarded only as much as the \$15.00 would cover. This family now on relief at Greenwood.

We are continuing to press the bill.  
Can you give us any advice in the matter.
