PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

The above made her declaration to the Custodian on a yellow (No property) card on June 9th, 1942, and was evacuated on September 8th, 1942.

From a letter on the file of the husband, File No. 804, mention is made that all of the family belongings were stored in the Japanese School (no doubt he meant the one at 154 West 5th Ave.), where some chattels were identified as belonging to Mrs. Tatsu MIYAGISHIMA. These were sold at Vancouver auctions Nos. 519, 521 and 44, for the net sum of \$7.05; which amount was credited to the account of the above. A cheque for this amount is being remitted to her closing out her account.

As nothing was declared, no inventory was taken, but everything identifiable under the family name has been sold. If the MIYAGISHIMA family complain of shortages later, then it should go on record that this Japanese school at 154 West 5th Ave., Vancouver, was entered by thieves on many different occasions.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.
