



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

August 21, 1946.

Re: Hichisuke SAKAI, Reg. No. 10960

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 9, 1942 in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However, on June 9, 1942 he requested shipment of 19 pieces of effects declared by his wife. Lacking evidence to the contrary we assume these were shipped to him.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this man was the owner of a vessel released to the Canadian Fishing Co. licensed owners. On July 20, 1942 we received the sum of \$110.00 from the Canadian Fishing Co. in payment of SAKAI's equity in the vessel.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$50.25 received as refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of his vessel.

On July 27, 1942 we remitted \$100.00 to SAKAI. We are today transferring the balance standing to his credit with this office \$60.25 to T. Maikawa Stores to be applied on a claim filed by that company against SAKAI, which debt SAKAI admitted in a letter written July 7, 1945.

Location of Boat at Sale: SAKAI did not declare this boat to the Custodian. However, on July 14, 1942, the Canadian Fishing Co. Ltd. sent to the Custodian the sum of \$110.00 on behalf of Hichisuke SAKAI. This money was to cover equity in the boat "Oceanic 263".

Claims Against Canadian Govt.: The "Oceanic 263" and the "ARC" are probably the same boat.

Your letter of June 16th, in regard to refund of expenses incurred in bringing a vessel from Prince Rupert to Steveston at the time of the impounding, has been received.

It is true that refund of expense money has been made, and your account has been credited with the sum of \$50.25 for expenses in connection with the vessel "ARC".
