Sute Nakagawa died at Sandon, B. C. on November 14, 1942. She is survived by her husband, Sasuke, file #1124; one son, Masao, file #1052; and four daughters, Mrs. Hideka (Mitsuko) Sayehiro, file #338, Miyoko, file #488 and Teruko and Nobue, minors.

The deceased declared no assets to the Custodian and none are revealed on the file.

The only claim filed against Mrs. NAKAGAWA is for the sum of \$50.00 to cover her funeral expenses paid by the B. C. Security Commission. As there were no funds to the credit of her Estate, this claim was referred to her husband, Sasuke, for payment. The claim is still outstanding on his file.

Thank you very much for your letter dated September 9th. Your letter indicates that your patient, if still living, must be about fifty-two years old. The Mrs. Shingo Hakagawa concerning whom we sent you our letter dated September 1st gives her age as twenty-seven, from which we assume that she was not your patient. Additionally, Mrs. Shingo Hakagawa states that she knows nothing whatever about the matter.

We also have on file a Mrs. Seisuke Hakagawa who gives her age as forty-five and who declared to us on June 10th that she had no assets and no liabilities. Her former address was Port Essington, B. C.

In the absence of more complete information regarding your patient we fear that there is nothing we can do to help you at this time. May we suggest that you be good enough to provide us with Mrs. S. Hakagawa's full name, the name of her husband, the date you last had contact with her and also Mrs. S. Hakagawa's police registration number which you may perhaps be able to obtain from the authorities in Prince Rupert.

When, with your assistance, we are able to identify your patient we shall be happy to do anything within our power towards effecting collection on your behalf.

state that my mother-in-law has never
resided in Prince Rupert or employed at
Inverness Cannery, neither did she receive
any treatment from Dr. C. W. Hankinson.

She came with the family from Vancouver
on May 20, 1932 and resided at Port Essington
till the evacuation order this March.

My late mother-in-law's full name
was Mrs. Sasuke (Sute) Nakagawa.

Please do not confuse her name with
another Mrs. S. Nakagawa who was residing
and employed at Inverness Cannery around
1932. This latter person had an accident
at that time and she was in a doctor's care.

I knew her slightly, so I do not know the
full particulars, but she passed away a
year or so after her misfortune. Her husband
is still living.

Further to our letter dated September 11th, we have to report having received a letter from an individual of the Japanese race advising us that there was a Mrs. S. Hakagawa who was residing at and employed by the Inverness Cannery around 1932. Our informant states that said Mrs. S. Hakagawa had had an accident at that time, that she was in the care of a doctor, and that she passed away in 1933 or 1934. Our informant does not know either her full name or the name of her husband although he believed that her husband may still be living.

We have done the best we can to identify your debtor, but in the absence of more complete particulars from you as to the full name of your patient, it is difficult for the Custodian to do anything further in the matter.
