RE: Yoshikazu FUJIMOTO

With reference to your memorandum of the 22nd instant, in view of the information in the B.C. Security Commission's letter of the 17th instant and the fact that Kazuo FUJIMOTO and Yoshihiro FUJIMOTO are sons of the above named, it would appear advisable to make the maintenance payments to the father as requested by the B.C. Security Commission, after payment of W.S. Rogers and Company's claim of \$39.27.

It would be advisable to write to Rogers and Company that upon receipt of a statutory declaration covering their claim, the Custodian would be pleased to give consideration to payment from FUJIMOTO'S funds with the Custodian.

I have your memorandum of December 15th, in connection with the debts owing by the above noted party to P/W A-647, Yoshihiro Fujimoto, P/W A-648, Kizuo Fujimoto and E.S. Rogers and Company.

I have discussed this matter with Mr. Wright and we have reached the decision that since our two internees are not pressing for payment, the claim of Rogers and Company should be paid in full, leaving the balance of the car money in Yoshikazu Fujimoto's account until such time as some further request is made, either by the internees or the father.

Thank you very much for your memo dated December 3rd.

Mr. Yoshikazu Fujimoto, #14419, File 10588, declared to us at the time he registered his assets with us on June 12th, that he was indebted to Kameo Fujimoto to the extent of \$400.00, that he was also indebted to Mr. Yoshihiro Fujimoto to the extent of \$400.00 and that he was also indebted to his two sons for back wages, that the amount of these wages depended upon sale of crops and at the same time he indicated that wages paid to the two boys in the previous year amounted to \$300.00 each.

Mr. Yoshikazu Fujimoto is also believed to be indebted to E. S. Rogers and Company to the extent of \$30.27.

Funds on hand at the present time in the account of Mr. Fujimoto do not exist, but when our disbursements have been settled Mr. Yoshikazu Fujimoto should have a credit balance of approximately \$230.00, and at that time we will be pleased to give consideration to the question of making some payment to the Enemy Section on behalf of your two internees.
