We rather understand from your letter of June 16th last year that the premises belonging to Tomoki Kawabe still contain some furniture and effects. If we are wrong and these have been moved to Nanaimo, please forward this letter to Mr. James.

We would ask you (or Mr. James if it applies to him) to ship the records as per our enclosure, to Manabu Kawabe, son of the owner of the house. We think it would be easiest to make shipment via the B. C. Security Commission in the usual way. We are sending them a copy of this letter and Release and asking them to note that we have not first referred this matter to them as we can take care of any reasonable charges from funds to the father's credit. We think Mr. Fisher prefers that freight charges be prepaid and two copies of Bills of Lading and shipping bills sent promptly to him at the B. C. Security Commission.
