This file reveals that Mrs. OBOKATA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

When Mrs. OBOKATA made her declaration to the Custodian on June 12/42 CHATTELS: she stated that she intended to sell all her furniture except what she was taking with her when she was evacuated. However an electric iron, vases, and a mixing bowl, removed from 1934 Triumph St., were sold in her name. She did not say anything about moving any goods to this address, but we are writing her today to make sure before transferring these out of her account.

She declared about \$70.00 owing to her for dressmaking, but did not know RECEIVABLE: the names and addresses of the debtors. No action was therefore taken b the Custodian.
