



This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 13, 1942. On September 9, 1942, she reported some changes in her declaration. She was evacuated on September 10, 1942.

Some chattels were reported by this woman to have been moved to the home of her father-in-law, Katsutaro YOSHIOKA, File 5413, at 944 West 8th Avenue. On January 16, 1946, she reported that these were the property of Katsutaro YOSHIOKA, and she requested that he be given credit for the proceeds of the sale of the goods sold. The sum of \$98.99, net proceeds of the sale of goods found at 944 West 8th Avenue, was therefore transferred from the account of Fusa YOSHIOKA to the account of Katsutaro YOSHIOKA.

Mrs. Fusa YOSHIOKA reported equipment of a fish & chip shop operated by herself at 2553 Alma Road. All goods found in this shop on June 27, 1942, was sold to the landlord for the sum of \$25.00, which has been credited to the account of Mrs. YOSHIOKA. For further details see the Chattel Summary.

Mrs. Fusa YOSHIOKA reported no other property of any kind, and no other property of any kind is revealed by her file.

On June 13, 1942, this woman signed a declaration to the Custodian in which she reported chattels at 2553 Alma Road, where she had been operating a coffee shop. On September 9, 1942, the day before her evacuation, she made a change in her declaration, regarding a bed and 16 boxes of china and kitchen utensils. On September 9, 1942, she reported that the bed and 23 boxes had been stored at 944 West 8th Avenue, the home of her father-in-law, Katsutaro YOSHIOKA, File 5413. On January 16, 1946, Mrs. Fusa YOSHIOKA stated that the goods found at 944 West 8th Avenue were the property of Katsutaro YOSHIOKA and requested that he be given the proceeds of the sale of the goods sold. Funds in her account from the sale of goods found at 944 West 8th Avenue, were therefore transferred to Account No. 5413, Katsutaro YOSHIOKA.

In her declaration of June 13, 1942, Mrs. YOSHIOKA reported the following goods, at 2553 Alma Road:

On June 27, 1942, C. Barrett-Lennard & Co., who investigated this property on behalf of the Custodian, reported that Mrs. YOSHIOKA had vacated her shop some weeks previously, and had sold almost everything of value, but had been unable to find a buyer for some of the equipment. The report lists the chattels on hand at June 27, 1942, and none of the items listed above were shown on this list. It would appear therefore that these were all disposed of by Mrs. YOSHIOKA before that date.

The following items declared on June 13, 1942, are dealt with in C. Barrett-Lennard & Co. report of June 27, 1942; the description shown is that given in the investigator's report:

- 1 Counter (1 rough counter)
- 1 Gas baking stove (In very bad condition, oven door held closed by wire, extremely dirty, so badly stained and corroded that I don't think it could be used for private use. I don't think dealers would pay sufficient to cover cost of dismantling and cartage)
- 1 Sawdust Burner (1 saw-dust burner attached to a cooking range. Stove is old, very dirty and is of little value)
- 3 Booths (constructed of rough lumber, badly perished, of no value unless new tenant wants to operate an eating house)
- 1 Carpet (Linoleum is of some value in the store but little value if taken out)
- 1 Neon Sign (Electric sign can be used only by fish & chip store, and is of little value)
- 1 Kitchen Table (table of soft wood and of little value)

CHattel SUMMARY - Continued

The report stated that it would be necessary to remove chattels from the premises before the end of June, otherwise the landlord had stated he would seize them for July rent. The landlord offered to purchase the goods for \$25.00, and this offer C. Barnett-Leonard recommended be accepted, as the only equipment considered worth moving were the two stoves, and these it was doubted would bring more than \$20.00, in a sale by auction. On July 6, 1942, cheque for \$25.00 was received from the landlord in payment of the purchase of the equipment, and this sum was credited to the account of Fusa YOSHIOKA.

Mrs. YOSHIOKA declared one slot machine for chewing gum. Although the report of C. Barrett-Lennard & Co. does not mention this machine, the statement of charges made by this investigator shows charge for "returning gum slot machine to owner and obtaining receipt. It would appear therefore that the machine was the property of some company and that it was returned to the owner.

Dear Sir: Re: KATSUHATA, Miss Fusa - File No. 10637

The declarant vacated her Fish & Chip stand at 2553 Alma Road some weeks ago, and before leaving sold almost everything of value, including glass mirrors in back-bar, etc.

She has stored at 944 W. 8th Ave the following:

(a) 1 bed (b) 10 boxes of chinaware & kitchen utensils.

The declarant informs me that she advertised the *remaining* equipment for sale on six different occasions, and could not obtain a buyer.

The following equipment remains on the premises which constitutes the remaining assets to be disposed of.

(a) 1 saw-dust burner attached to a cooking range. (This stove is old and very dirty, and is of little value).

(b) 1 gas baking stove. This is in very bad condition, oven door held closed by wire, extremely dirty, so badly stained and corroded that I don't think it could be used by anyone for private use. I don't think the gas range dealers would pay sufficient for it to cover cost of dismantling and cartage.

(c) 1 kitchen table of soft wood & of little value

(d) 1 rough counter ✓

(e) Linoleum. ✓ This is some value in the store, but little value if taken out.

(f) 3 booths. These are constructed of rough lumber, are badly perished, and have no value unless the new tenant operates an eating house. Even then he may not want them.

(g) Electric sign "Fish & Chips". This can only be used by a Fish & Chip store, and is of little value.

It will be necessary to dispose of equipment before June 30th, otherwise, rent for July becomes due, and the landlord has notified me that he proposes seizing the equipment for the July rent.

The landlord has offered to pay \$ 25.00 for the equipment mentioned. If I do not accept this offer, it will be necessary to dismantle & remove everything by June 30th.


I have two alternatives which are as follows:

- (a) Accept the offer of the landlord of \$ 25.00, or
- (b) Dismantle the two stoves, and remove them together with anything else of value. Place this equipment with an auctioneer in his show rooms for sale by auction.

The counter & booths would not be worth removing, and I doubt if the stoves could be sold for \$ 20.00.

I, therefore, recommend that the offer of the landlord as per "A" be accepted.

I wish to refer to my letter of June 27th.

1. Location and Nature of Business. Fish and Chip store at 2553 Alma Road. (Business closed, and all readily saleable equipment either sold or removed before Agent took possession.

2. Ownership. Miss Fusa Katsuhata.

3. Financial Position. There do not appear to be any liabilities, and I enclose herewith cheque of \$ 25.00, being proceeds from a private sale of equipment which was left on the premises. Mr. George Caros, the landlord, was the purchaser, and I believe he paid more than the junk was worth. His reason for buying was to obtain possession of the store.

4. Insurance. Nil

5. Contracts. Nil

6. Prospects for continued operations. Nil

7. Recommendations. All saleable equipment had been disposed of by declarant before vacating the store. She had previously endeavored to sell by advertising in a local newspaper on six different occasions, without success.

The Equipment left on the premises at 2553 Alma Road was:

(a) 1 sawdust burner attached to an old cook stove. (The stove is very dirty, and of little value.) ✓

(b) 1 gas baking stove in terrible condition, and of little value. ✓

(c) 1 kitchen soft-wood table. ✓

(f) 3 booths - no value. Sold

(g) Electric sign.

At that time we agreed that a sale to the Landlord of the balance of the equipment left in the Fish and Chip store should be made. We notice that this transaction has now been completed and we acknowledge your cheque for the proceeds of same for \$25.00.

We note that Miss Katsuhata has stored one bed and ten boxes of chinaware at 944 West 8th Avenue which house is owned by Mr. Katsutaro Yoshioka.

Our Agents for this property are Messrs. Macaulay, Nicolls, Maitland & Company Ltd., and we have written them to-day in connection with the safe keeping of the personal effects of Miss Katsuhata referred to above. On reference to Miss Katsuhata's registration form we notice that there appear to be a few items of personal effects not included in the goods sold for \$25.00 and in addition to the bed and ten boxes of chinaware being stored. We presume, however, that everything has now been cleaned up as far as the personal property at 2553 Alma Road is concerned.

In connection with our file #10637 in the name of Miss Fuse Katsuhata, our Agent, Mr. Barrett-Lennard, advises us that Miss Katsuhata has stored at 944 West 8th Avenue one bed and ten boxes of chinaware and kitchen utensils. This property is owned by Mr. Katsutaro Yoshioka, whose affairs are being handled, on our behalf, by yourselves under our file #5413.

Mr. Barrett-Lennard's report states that the Yoshiokas claim that they have a tenant when they vacate and that this tenant will look after the property owned by Miss Katsuhata.

On referring to our file #5413 and your reports in connection therewith, we notice that your recommendation is that this property should be boarded up as soon as it is vacated. You do not enlarge at all upon your reason for this recommendation and we are wondering why it is not possible that this building can be made revenue bearing. PERSONAL PROPERTY AT 944 WEST 8th AVENUE

1. Katsutaro YOSHIOKA, File No. 5413, widower, Age - 61, declares effects at 944 West 8th Avenue. These were later moved, comprising 22 boxes and one carton. On November 30th Katsutaro Y. confirms these are all his chattels in the restricted area, but some obviously belong to Mrs. Fusa Yoshioka, wife of son, Masajiro.
2. The house is registered in the name of son, Sutejiro YOSHIOKA, File No. 11341, not registered, age unknown, apparently no chattels. Wife - Mrs. Fumiko Y., yellow card, age 35.
3. Asajiro YOSHIOKA, File No. 1393, another son, age 38, declares the house in the name of (two) above but owned jointly by himself and the following:
 - J. (?) Jack Yoshio YOSHIOKA
 - K. (?) Father Katsutaro Y.
 - F. (?) Fumiko Y., wife of Sutejiro Y.

Most of his furniture appears to have been sold to the tenant of 944 West 8th Avenue. This should be confirmed. His wife is Tazuko Y., File No. 10904, age 27, yellow card.

With reference to the above this is to inform you that the twenty-two boxes and one carton, making twenty-three packages in all, were declared by Mr. Katsutaro YOSHIOKA as being owned by him. These goods were removed in November 1942 to our warehouse at Powell Street and eventually sold by auction, the net proceeds after expenses were taken into account being \$55.88, and this amount has been credited to the account of the above.

We appreciate that twenty-three packages were also mentioned by you but in view of the definite statement that these were owned by your father-in-law, Mr. Katsutaro Yoshioka, we have taken it that the contents were his property.

As regards the remaining chattels, these were eventually removed to auction and sold for the sum of \$97.59, after allowing for auctioneering expenses, etcetra, and the above amount has been credited to your account.

The above takes care of the chattels that were left at 944 West 8th Avenue, Vancouver, and we would point out that it was quite impossible for us to make any further division of these chattels in view of the fact that several persons declared in their JP forms that they had left chattels at this address, but practically no details were given. In the circumstances we have done the best we can with regard to the allocation of the proceeds derived from the auctions and in order that our files may be completed in regard to this matter, we shall be glad if you will please sign the copy of this letter as no funds can be released until agreement is reached on this question of chattels.

A copy of this letter is being forwarded to the other declarants of chattels at these premises that they may know the action we have taken in this matter.
