Dear Madam:-

When Mr. Rikio Nishimura registered with the Custodian on April 1st, he declared the following:

"Confectionery and tobacco and magazines and one Coca Cola Cooler valued \$200.00 (Balance of \$30.00 due on cooler).

"No inventory taken. Store being operated by sister, Hatsue Nishimura, 206 Main Street, Vancouver, B. C.

"Personal effects at 206 Main St., Vancouver, B. C. in owner's possession."

He subsequently advised us that you sold the cooler and settled with the Coca Cola Company. The latter confirmed this statement.

As you declared no property whatsoever to the Custodian, we quite understand that prior to evacuation you disposed of all the remaining assets of the store managed by you and him and that there is nothing further in the restricted area which the Custodian need look to on your behalf. To have our records absolutely clear, however, we would like your confirmation that this is so. Alternatively, what is the name of your other brother who, we believe, actually operated the store in order that we may enquire from him exactly what happened.
