GENERAL SUMMARY

Tadao OMORI, Deceased

Reg. No. 09120

Tadao Omori, who was evacuated on July 10, 1942, committed suicide at Vernon, B. C. on May 15, 1946.

He is survived by his sister Mrs. May Reid, Hollyburn, West Vancouver, and an Uncle, Yoneichi Iida, file #12363.

OMORI declared to the Custodian that he had, in his possession, nine \$10.00 War Savings Certificates. These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The account of the deceased, in this office, was credited with the sum of \$6.30, being refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

A claim against a "Tatsuo" OMORI appears on this file for the sum of \$4.00, lodged by M. Ebisuzaki Co. This was referred to Tadao OMORI and he advised that Tatsuo OMORI had returned to Japan. No other claims appear on this file.

We were advised of the death of OMORI by the Department of Labour on June 19, 1946. They also advised that the affairs of the deceased had been placed in the hands of Lindsay & Kidston, Barristers and Solicitors, Vernon. From correspondence with Mr. Kidston, who is the Official Administrator at Vernon, B. C., it was learned that the only assets of the deceased at the time of his death amounted to \$53.52. As the assets of the deceased were not sufficient to pay the funeral expenses paid by Yoneichi IIDA, uncle of OMORI, the Official Administrator had the deceased's sister, Mrs. May Reid, renounce in his favour and paid the total amount, less Commission of 5% to Mr. IIDA. The total funds to the credit of the deceased, in this office, amounting to \$6.30, were forwarded to Mr. Kidston on October 3, 1946.

The affairs of the deceased were placed in the hands of Messrs. Lindsay and Kidston, Barristers and Solicitors, Vernon, B. C., by a relative of the deceased and the small credit balance in his account in this office in the sum of \$6.35, being refund of 1½ wage deduction for 1941, was forwarded to that firm. It is understood, however, that the assets of the deceased at the time of his death were insufficient to pay his funeral expenses.



I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of
the 25th inst. addressed to my firm.

When Omori died he had in his possession \$48.52
and personal effects which brought in \$5.00 making total assets
\$53.52. He had a sister living in Vancouver (Hollyburn), Mrs. May
Reid of 1131 Duchess Ave. The funeral expenses were paid by deceased's
uncle, Y. Iida, then living in the camp at Tashme near Hope, B.C.

As the assets were not nearly sufficient to cover
the funeral expenses I had Mrs. Reid renounce in my favour the right
to apply for administration but I did not actually take out Letters.
I merely forwarded all moneys received to the Deputy Minister of
Finance at Victoria and after deducting my commission at 5% paid the
whole balance to Mr. Iida.

It follows that I could not give you a completely
satisfactory receipt and discharge for any moneys in your hands with-
out taking out Letters of Administration and I would, therefore, be
pleased to learn how much you have on hand. If it is only a small
amount I would suggest that it be sent to Mr. Iida, if his present
whereabouts is known to you.

We have just been advised that the above-named
committed suicide at Vernon, B.C., on May 15th, 1946.
Our Tashme office advises as follows:

"The affairs of Mori, through some authority
were placed in the hands of a lawyer named Ketdson, of
Vernon, B.C., and our information is to the effect that
he has already disposed of some of the assets of the
deceased, and is also in possession of certain monies
belonging to the same. It would appear that Iida has been
in communication with the sister, May Reid, and has some
kind of authority from her to take over the assets, including
the money.

For your information, Iida went from Tashme to
Vernon to take care of the disposal of the deceased, brought
the body to Tashme, and took charge of all the funeral arrange-
ments. In consequence, he is out of pocket a considerable
sum of money and feels that some consideration and attention
should be given to him in this case."

The deceased's nearest relative is May Reid,
1131 Duchess Ave., Hollyburn P.O., West Vancouver, sister,
and the next relative in line is an uncle, Iida Yoneichi.
