
Radio with D.M.L. Anderson - 2170 W. 29th Ave., Vancouver.

All these persons acknowledged care of the effects, and under date of April 21st, 1944, Dr. BANNO acknowledged that all goods in care of the first two persons had been disposed of to his satisfaction. He was unable however to locate Mrs. J. Lawson.

Herewith we enclose Custodian's cheque in the amount of \$4.42 being the amount of your credit on our books.

Your file has been reviewed and we note that all the personal effects that you listed with the Custodian and which were left in care of various people in Vancouver were disposed of to your satisfaction, in accordance with your letter to us of April 21st, 1944.

You declared the ownership of 2 - \$50.00 and 1 - \$100.00 Victory Bond, also \$90.00 in War Saving Certificates which were in your own possession and did not come under the control of the Custodian. Your account number 1286 in the Bank of Montreal, Main & Hastings Streets, in which you had a deposit of \$1000.00, your life insurance policies in the Sun Life Assurance Co., and Dominion Life Insurance Co., for \$1000.00 each remained in your possession and were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

The security light deposit of \$4.42 was refunded by the B.C. Electric Railway and placed to your credit.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area, which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
