

Dear Madam

This is to advise that we have, today, forwarded to you by insured parcel post the camera which you had surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

Shipping costs on this camera amounted to 21 cents, made up of postage of 16 cents and 5 cents for packing costs. We are enclosing 4 cents in stamps, being the balance of the 25 cents which you sent to us.

We have reviewed your file and the file of your husband, and it is noted that you both declared that you owned no property of any kind whatsoever left in the protected area. It would appear, therefore, that the camera which has now been returned to you was the only property belonging to either of you left in this area.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge receipt of the camera which has been mailed to you separately, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

GENERAL SUMMARY

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 16, 1942, to the effect that she owned no property of any kind whatsoever left in the protected area.

The camera, dealt with in Specified Articles Memorandum, was reported by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and identified as her property by means of the RCMP Receipt which she sent to us on November 17, 1945.

This file reveals no liabilities.

This file reveals no other property of any kind whatsoever.

It is noted, however, that the file of this woman's husband, File 11572, contains a declaration to the effect that no property of any kind was left in the protected area, and auction sheets showing sale of chattels to the value of \$244.28. This matter may be cleared up when a reply is received to our letter of this date to Mrs. SHIMO.
