NATSUHARA denied the two latter claims and the B.C. Electric claim was paid from funds standing to the credit of his wife on Sept. 14/46.

We enclose herewith Custodian cheques in the sum of \$29.64.
As this is your total credit with this office we are now closing your
file.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you made
your declaration to the Custodian on May 7th, 1942, you declared chattels
at 161 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver. Chattels found and identified as
belonging to you were sold at auction for the net sum of \$4.22, and this
sum credited to your account with this office.

The radio which you surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted
Police was handed over by them to the Custodian and sold at auction for
the net sum of \$27.17 and this sum credited to your account with this
office.

As requested in your letter received in this office on September
13th, 1946, we have remitted a cheque in the sum of \$1.76 to the B. C.
Electric Railway Co. Ltd. in payment of their claim filed against your husband.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of
every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian,
and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are
enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
