



The above signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 17, 1942 and was evacuated on September 9, 1942.

CHATELS: She declared chattels left at 3713 West 10th. and 3735 West 10th. The chattels at 3735 West 10th. seem for the most part to have been accounted for. However, as will be seen in the attached chattel summary and schedule, none of the goods left at 3713 West 10th. were recovered. It would not seem likely that they were of much value.

Part of the proceeds of the chattels from 3735 West 10th. were transferred by Mr. Spain from this file to that of Iwazo, husband of the above, as they consisted of store equipment.

INSURANCE: Mention is made of two insurance policies held by the husband. These were surrendered and the proceeds, \$43.80, credited to his account.

CHattel SUMMARY

Re: MATSUMIYA, Iwazo - Reg. No. 00187
MATSUMIYA, Chiyoeko - Reg. No. 00191.

Chiyoeko MATSUMIYA declared chattels but her husband merely stated that his wife had the list of chattels.

Orr's Stores, on being asked what care was being given to the chattels left at 3713 West 10th, stated that all that could be found was 1 kitchen cupboard and 1 ice box. Mrs. MATSUMIYA was advised of this. Later it was discovered that the kitchen cabinet and the ice box had evidently been destroyed by tenants of 3713 West 10th. Mr. and Mrs. MATSUMIYA evidently did not consider their chattels very valuable as they did not request any information regarding their disposition. On being advised that the bulk of the chattels could not be found, Mrs. MATSUMIYA merely said that it was "not in order" and that the Custodian should deal with the situation in his own way as she could do nothing from Slocan.

Of the items left in the care of Mr. Arnold at 3735 West 10th, the only thing not accounted for is the baby bicycle. The memorandum of July 3, 1943 on file 10802 bears a note by Mr. Smith as follows: "the bicycles were sold and the money paid to the Japanese before evacuation". Mr. Arnold's letter of July 12, 1946 mentions only the delivery bicycle and it can only be assumed that Mrs. MATSUMIYA took the bicycle with them when they were evacuated.

No mention is made on the file of the carpet left at Crone's Storage. They are being contacted to-day - advise him by owner - 2/9/47 - see letter 2/13/47.

Neither Mr. or Mrs. MATSUMIYA declared any chattels left at the B. C. Purchasers Warehouse. There seems to be little doubt that they are the correct owners as, according to Morris & MacLennan's list, Iwazo MATSUMIYA is the name given. It is to be noted that many who left goods at the B. C. Purchasers' Warehouse did not register them with the Custodian. A plate board is not accounted for. Many shipments were made by Morris & MacLennan before the Custodian moved the rest of the chattels to auction.

MEMORANDUM.

To: Mr. Spain.

From: A. G. McArthur.

Re: Iwazo MATSUMIYA, Reg. #00187,
Chiyoko MATSUMIYA, Reg. No. 00191.

Both these Japanese persons together with a child of 3 years returned to Japan on the "General Heiga" June 17, 1946. They received from the Dominion Treasury the sum of \$450.00. Their assets with the Custodian consist of a balance of \$7.56 to the credit of Iwazo Matsumiya, and a credit of \$144.11 to the credit of Chiyoko Matsumiya.

A letter from the Prudential Insurance Co. of America dated June 25th with an attachment indicates that the proceeds of two policies in a total of \$43.80 is proposed to be transferred to William Edwin Graham, Slocan, B.C. under a Power of Attorney. I would suggest that a creditor, the Burrard Fish Co. Ltd. be paid the full amount of funds to the credit of Iwazo Matsumiya and that the credit balance of Chiyoko Matsumiya be transferred to the Receiver General of Canada. The Prudential Insurance Co. should be told to send in the proceeds of the insurance policies to this office with particulars of the insured and the beneficiaries, and the proceeds credited to the accounts in accordance with this information.

For your information, the Power of Attorney given to Mr. Graham would be ineffectual under the circumstance of the vesting of the interests of the repatriates in the Custodian, and particularly in this case where there are debts the Custodian will exercise his discretion in using available funds to pay them.
