PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 10632

Re: Eizaburo MARUNO, Reg. No. 02047

This man was an employee of the Union Fish Co. Ltd. He lived at 2275 McGill Street, Vancouver, B. C. prior to his evacuation. These premises were owned by Miss Hinaye MARUNO, File 9347, and were leased to Mrs. Nellie Harrison, who appears to have been a friend of the MARUNO family. Eizaburo MARUNO was evacuated on April 7, 1942. He signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 10, 1942.

In his declaration to the Custodian MARUNO stated that he owned no chattels. His wife, File 10608, stated that all furniture had been sold. However, the tenant at 2275 McGill acknowledged having in her possession the goods listed in the Chattel Schedule. These goods have apparently been accounted for by sale and shipment. The goods sold were sold by the tenant at the request of Mr. MARUNO, and the funds which were paid to the Custodian were credited to the account of his wife. Cost of packing and shipping of the goods shipped was charged to the account of Mrs. MARUNO.

MARUNO declared the sum of \$2,500.00 due him from the Union Fish Company Ltd. This sum was paid in full on June 18, 1942, by cheque from P.S. Ross & Sons, and the funds were credited to the account of Eizaburo MARUNO.

P.S. Ross & Sons informed us on October 9, 1942, that a commission of \$45.00 was due MARUNO for collections made by him on behalf of the Union Fish Co. Ltd. This sum was paid direct to MARUNO by P.S. Ross & Sons.

This file shows that MARUNO holds 3,500 shares in the Union Fish Co. Ltd. No distribution to shareholders of this company has as yet been made by the liquidators. *see letter of Dec 29/47 and receipt for \$3,500.00 Dec 23/48 Jm*

The sum of \$7.74 refund of 1940 Income Tax was received on February 12, 1943, and was credited to the account of MARUNO.

On March, 17, 1944, MARUNO requested this office to try to locate a box 9 1/2" x 12" x 17", containing books, which he had left at the Union Fish Co., 469 Powell Street. He was informed on March 29, 1944, that this box could not be found.

On November, 16/43, MARUNO filed proof of debt showing the sum of \$835.00 due him from T. Matsuyama & Co. Ltd. The books of the company showed that the sum of \$1,475.00 was due MARUNO and Kiheiichi TABAYASHI from T. Matsuyama & Co. Ltd., and cheque for this sum was received from P.S. Ross & Sons and credited to a joint account for these two men. Information on file shows that distribution of these funds should be on the basis of two-thirds to MARUNO and one-third to TABAYASHI. Therefore the sum of \$983.33 is being transferred to the account of MARUNO from the joint account. *see memo of Oct 29/47.*

On September 9, 1947, MARUNO inquired about the following items:

2. Property on which the Union Fish Co. Ltd. was situated. *- no reply & letter of Oct 27/47 no further action Jm*
3. Union Fish Co. Ltd. shares. *See payment of \$3,500.00 Dec 13/48 Jm*

MARUNO declared Victory Bonds to the value of \$8,000.00 and a War Loan to the value of \$500.00 in the Royal Bank of Canada, Main & Hastings, Vancouver. These were not brought under the control of this office.

The goods sold were sold by the tenant at the request of Mr. MARUMO, and the funds received from these sales were credited to the account of Mrs. MARUMO.

✓ Rubber hose-----ship to us ✓

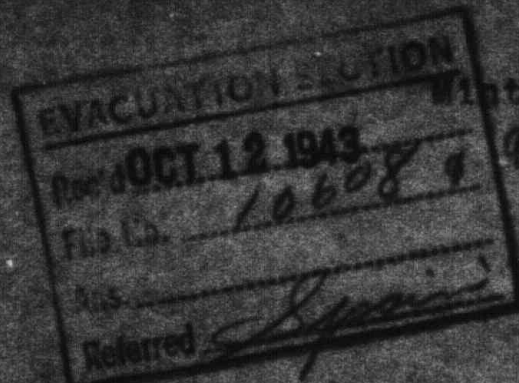
With the money you are going to give us for the dresser, please pay the transportation to the steamer. If there is not enough, we'll send the money.

We enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the sum of \$734.74.
As this is your total credit with this office we are now closing your file.

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted. You did not declare any chattels and those articles which your family left in care of Mrs. Nellie Harrison have already been disposed of in accordance with the requirements of your family.

Your account was credited with the sum of \$2500.00, being repayment of your loan to the Union Fish Company. Your account has also been credited with the sum of \$30.00, received from your brother, Masaki, representing a refund of security deposit for light. We received from the Income Tax Department the sum of \$7.74, being a refund of overpayment of income tax for the year 1940, and this sum was also credited to your account. From this total credit of \$2537.74, three remittances totalling the sum of \$1800.00 have been sent to you leaving your balance at \$737.74 as mentioned above.

Your file reveals that you own 3500 shares in the Union Fish Company, which company is now in the process of being liquidated.

We were advised that you held a policy in the London & Scottish Association. This policy was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.






