GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 10931

Kanematsu SHIBATA,

Kanematsu SHIBATA died at the Vancouver General Hospital on December 25, 1942, at the age of 74 years. He is survived by his widow, Itano, file #10537, and three daughters, Matsuye, file #10538, Yuriko, file #10539, and Toshiko, file #13688.

A Custodian "No Property" card was signed on behalf of the deceased by his daughter, Matsuye, as Kanematsu SHIBATA was in the hospital at that time. The file reveals, however, that a small quantity of personal effects were removed from his home at 215 Princess Street and placed in Custodian Storage in his name. On March 25, 1943, a request was received from Mrs. SHIBATA for shipment of a quantity of these goods. Shipment was made as shown on the Chattel Schedule on file. On September 1, 1943, a further request for shipment of a record player and box of records was received. The records were shipped but the record player could not be found. It appears, however that this was sold at Vancouver Auction #42 for the sum of \$17.50. A further shipment of goods was made to Mrs. Shibata in November, 1943. A number of articles, which were apparently included in eleven cartons and six boxes which were removed to Custodian Storage and not shipped, were sold at auction for a net amount of \$42.11, including proceeds from sale of radio gramophone attachment before mentioned.

The only claim filed against the deceased is for the sum of \$80.00 to reimburse the B. C. Security Commission for expenses incurred in connection with his burial. In a telephone conversation with Mrs. Scobie of the Department of Labour she stated that the Department would not press their claim for funeral expenses and that the credit balance of the deceased, \$42.11, could be forwarded to Mrs. SHIBATA.

Custodian cheque for \$42.11 is today being forwarded to the widow, closing the account of the deceased in this office.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

Respecting the above, we have already closed the file of the widow, Itama SHIRATA, File No. 10537, and on discussing this matter with Mr. Johnston he advised that as the amount standing to the credit of the deceased is less than \$100.00 we do not have to report the matter to the Official Administrator and all that it is necessary to do is to send a check to the Department of Labor, Japanese Division, for \$42.11, being the total amount standing to the credit of the deceased, as part payment of the funeral expenses incurred by them, namely \$82.00.

As this file 10531 is on your list, will you now please deal with this matter and close the file?

Subtense we should write a note to Mrs. Shibata stating what we have done but Mr. Johnston confirms that it is not necessary for us to obtain Mrs. Shibata's permission to pay the claim in question, which has priority.

Enclosed is Custodian cheque in the sum of \$42.11,  
being the entire credit balance in the account of your late  
husband, Kamenatsu Shibata, in this office.

Mr. Shibata declared no assets to the Custodian but  
a small quantity of personal effects were removed from  
215 Princess Street and placed in Custodian Storage in his  
name. At your request, a quantity of these goods was shipped  
to you, the remainder was sold at auction for a net amount of  
\$42.11. No other assets belonging to your husband have come  
under the control of the Custodian.

The Department of Labour filed a claim against the  
Estate of your late husband for the sum of \$80.00 to cover  
the cost of his funeral. They have, however, agreed not to  
press for payment of this claim in order that the balance of  
funds to your husband's credit, \$42.11, may be sent to you.

We are in receipt of your letter of December 5th with enclosures, and would advise that our records do not reveal that there is anything belonging to the above Japanese person in storage at 604 Cordova Street, Vancouver, B.C.

On checking the file of the husband, Kanematsu SHIBATA, now deceased, it is revealed that apart from those shipped to Mrs. Shibata, the chattels which were moved from 215 Princess Avenue to 604 Cordova Street in November 1942 in the name of the above deceased were sold at auction in March of 1945 and March of 1946, the proceeds being credited to the husband's account. Our records do not indicate that Mrs. Shibata was advised of the sale of the remaining chattels and it is possible those sold may be the chattels she is now requesting you to ship to her. The proceeds from the sale of the above-mentioned chattels in the amount of \$42.11, however, have not been remitted as there is on file a claim for \$80.00 by the Department of Labour for funeral expenses in connection with the burial of Kanematsu SHIBATA.


