These sums were credited to the account of Minoru ADACHI, husband of this woman, File 11470, and were remitted to him. The sewing machine, a box of china and some frames were sold for the net sum of \$37.39, which was credited to the account of Oki ADACHI. 2 tables, 2 chairs and 3 crocks were sold for the net sum of \$10.06. This sum was credited to the husband's account, File 11470. The remainder of the chattels declared by this woman appear to have been shipped.
