

Dear Sir & Madam:

The letter of February 2nd, written on behalf of Mr. ADACHI by Mr. E. THURRI, has been received. In reply, we wish to inform you that the sewing machine about which you inquired has been sold. Your chattels were declared by both of you. The greater part of these chattels were shipped to you. A washing machine and a kitchen stove were sold on your behalf by the May Lumber Company, who sent to this office the proceeds from these sales, a total amount of \$85.00. This money was remitted to Mr. ADACHI in September and October, 1943. Chattels, identified as the property of Mr. ADACHI, were sold at auction by the Custodian and the net proceeds of the sale were credited to his account, in the amount of \$10.06. The sewing machine and a few small articles were sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$37.39, which has been credited to the account of MRS. ADACHI. A carton of personal effects is stored in Custodian warehouse at Vancouver under the name of Mr. Minoru ADACHI.

The seven \$5.00 War Savings Certificates, bank account and life insurance policy, which were declared by Mr. ADACHI, did not come under the control of this office.

The total sum standing to your credit with this office, in the two accounts, is \$47.45. This money is available to you upon request.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

In her declaration to the Custodian, May 7th, 1942, this woman declared no property of any kind whatsoever left in the Protected Area.

On June 30th, 1942, she sent us a list of household and personal belongings left at the Japanese Community Hall at Paldi, B. C. Of the articles declared the washing machine and kitchen stove were sold by Mayo Lumber Company for \$50.00 and \$35.00 respectively. These sums were credited to the account of Minoru ADACHI, husband of this woman, File 11470, and were remitted to him. The sewing machine, a box of china and some frames were sold for the net sum of \$37.39, which was credited to the account of Oki ADACHI. 2 tables, 2 chairs and 3 crocks were sold for the net sum of \$10.06. This sum was credited to the husband's account, File 11470. The remainder of the chattels declared by this woman appear to have been shipped.
