GENERAL SUMMARY

Tommy Komma died at Slocan, B. C. on October 28, 1945. .  
He is survived by his widow, Matsu, file #10947; four sons,  
Joseph, file 10944, Eddy, file 2774, Seiji, file 12396,  
Shingo, file 3253; and two daughters, Yoshi and Sumiko.

The deceased declared no assets to the Custodian  
but, when goods was removed from the Great Northern Cannery  
to Custodian storage, several items belonging to him were  
discovered. Details of goods found and identification are  
given in the Chattel Schedule and Personal Property Summary  
on file. The chattels belonging to the deceased were sold  
at auction for a net amount of \$3.46, and Custodian cheque  
for this amount is today being forwarded to the widow, Matsu  
Komma. The account of the deceased in this office is now  
closed.

The only claim filed against the deceased is for the  
sum of \$80.00 to cover funeral expenses paid by the Department  
of Labour. Upon being advised by telephone of the small amount  
at credit, Mr. Brown of the Department of Labour, stated that  
the Department would be willing to relinquish their claim.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned  
above, appear on this file.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: HOMMA, Toney (Deceased) - Reg. No. 06594.

The above signed a declaration to the Custodian, to the effect that he had no property, on June 22, 1942 and was evacuated on September 1, 1942.

CHATELS: When the chattels were moved from the Great Northern Cannery to 604 East Cordova 2 large boxes marked HOMMA, T. were found. The lists of chattels found there were sent to all the Japanese who had lived at the Cannery in an effort to identify their belongings. HOMMA acknowledged that the boxes belonged to him and also claimed 2 dressers, 1 Ice box and 1 High chair which appeared on the inventories and one Buddhist Stand which was not found at the Cannery. One box of papers is stored at 604 East Cordova and the other cannot be found. Only two dressers were inventoried at the Cannery and these were claimed by Gonsuke OKINO, File 2405 as well as by HOMMA. OKINO declared furniture and household goods while HOMMA declared nothing and therefore, the proceeds of the sale of the dressers has been credited to Gonsuke OKINO. The Ice box and high chair have been transferred from File 2405 to which they had been erroneously credited.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
