We confirm telephone conversation of to-day. For your information we think we should review what has taken place previously. Under File L2150, Toyoko UMETSU, we have correspondence dealing with the T. R. Cleaners and Dressmakers of 610 Davie Street. Unfortunately, we have no other information than this as no one has registered under this name or given us the proprietor's name of the T. R. Cleaners. Some time ago we received a letter from a Mrs. Reid to the effect that she held a Check No. 552 for a dress left at the T. R. Cleaners for cleaning purposes. When she went there to claim the dress, she found the establishment closed, and since that time we have been trying to find the whereabouts of the owners. Our Mr. Smith found that the dress was at 1810 Powell Street where a Mrs. T. Ishihara was residing. We wrote to Mrs. Reid requesting her to call there, which she has done and reported to this office this morning that 1810 Powell Street was also evacuated by the Japanese, and now occupied by a white lady. Mr. Smith stated that the dress, a light blue crepe one with small necklace attached, was there, and that it probably belonged to Mrs. Reid. Mrs. Reid would like to contact Mrs. T. Ishihara who, we understand, is now at Hastings Park, but perhaps you could find out from Mrs. Ishihara if she has the dress, and if so have it sent here, when we can ask Mrs. Reid to call for it.

Apart from the above it would also be of interest to us to know what members of the Ishihara family were connected with the T. R. Cleaners, also if they owned the establishment, and what has become of the chattels that they must have owned, as well as identify for us Toyoko UMETSU.
