Some time ago we recoived a letter from a Mrs. Reid to the offect that she held a Check No. 552 for a dress left of the T. B. Cleaners for elecning purposes. Then she west there to claim the dress, she found the establishment closed, and since that tion we have been toyin to find the therencouse of the owners. our Mr. Smith found that the dress was at 1810 Possil Street requesting her to call there, which she has done and reported to this office this soreing that 1810 Penall Street was also evereusted by the Japanese, and now occupied by a white lady. Mr. Smith stated that the dress, a light blue crops one with small necklace attached, was there, and that it probably belonged to Mrs. held, Mrs. Rold would like to contact Mrs. 7. Ichihara sho, we understand, is now at Hastings Park, but perhaps you could find out from Mrs. Ishihare if she has the dress, and if so have it sent here, then we can ask irs. Reid to call for it.

Apart from the above it would also be of interest to us to know that members of the Ishihars family were connected with the T. R. Cleaners, also if they omed the establishment, and that has become of the chattels that they must have owned, as well as identify for us Toyoko USETOU.
