

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 22, 1942. He was evacuated on September 26, 1942.

Chattels:

12 Volumes Book of the World, one Japanese Doll, Kitchen Utensils and Glassware declared, were brought from Woodfibre and stored at 992 Powell Street, a total of 11 pieces of freight. On October 16, 1942, the B. C. Security Commission took delivery of 4 cartons of household effects and on May 29, 1943, the Commission took delivery of 7 pieces. All for delivery to the above-named man, who, on the 2nd of September, 1942, confirmed that these 11 pieces were all the property he had in the protected area.

A Singer Sewing Machine declared by this man's wife will be dealt with on her file (#11282).

Life Insurance:

Life policy with Dai Semei Hoken, Tokyo, Japan - \$5,000.00. Beneficiary: Mine YAMORI, his wife. Policy in possession of Kikusaburo YAMORI, and did not come under Custodian's control.

Accounts Receivable:

Refund of Wage Deductions, 1% for period January to June, 1941, in the amount of \$6.41, received in this office and credited to the account of Kikusaburo YAMORI.

Specified Articles:

The camera described in Specified Articles Summary was mailed to Kikusaburo YAMORI on July 10, 1945, and receipt of shipment acknowledged by him on August 30, 1945.

Please refer to warehouse list No. 103 of May 25th, 1942. This consists of the following.

- 4 Cartons
- 2 Bundles of chairs
- Sanitary couch
- Bundle of chain
- Bed ends, rails, and spring

This was confirmed as correct by the owner in September 1942 though in June when he registered he only declared items which could have been stored in the cartons which have since been sent to him. The remaining items would not have been of much value but there should be a record in the warehouse of their disposal.

Would you please look into this and return the file whereupon I will arrange refund of this man's credit balance and at the same time ask his wife (file 11292) about some things said to be left by her with a friend at Woodfibre.

As requested in your letter of June 25th, we have sent to you by insured parcel post the camera which you surrendered to the police.

Cost of mailing this camera amounted to 21 cents. This has been deducted from the \$6.41 which we are holding to your credit. This leaves funds to the amount of \$6.20 still in our hands belonging to you.

We note your remarks regarding the Singer Sewing Machine left at the home of Mr. Bill Smith, Woodfibre. This matter will be left as it is until we hear from you.

The camera should be in your hands within the course of the next few days. If you do not receive it, let us know.

Dear Sir:

Enclosed herewith is Custodian cheque in the amount of \$6.20, representing all funds standing to your credit with this office.

In your declaration to the Custodian you reported a quantity of chattels, all of which were shipped to you through the British Columbia Security Commission.

On June 25, 1945, you informed us that the sewing machine, declared by Mrs. Yamori, was still in the care of Mr. Bill Smith, of Wood-fibre, and you stated that you would write us later about this. As you are satisfied with the arrangements made in regard to this machine, this office will take no action in connection with this.

Your life insurance policy did not come under the control of this office.

You have already informed us that the camera we mailed to you on July 10th has been received by you.

The sum of \$6.41 was received from the Provincial Government on your behalf and was credited to your account. This sum was the refund of 15 wage deductions for the period from January to June, 1941.

Postage on your camera, amounting to 21 cents was charged to your account, leaving the sum of \$6.20 to your credit. This sum is being remitted to you by the enclosed cheque.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the enclosed cheque we attach a stamped, addressed envelope for your reply.



"As for the \$300.00 to Mr. Kikusaburo YAMORI, I do admit I am indebted to that amount, not to Mr. YAMORI, but to his cousin Mr. Shingai, who is in Japan at the present time. It was a debt incurred about 15 years ago.

I am very anxious to settle this debt but as you know, I am 70 years of age and am wholly dependent on my son for livelihood. I will try my utmost to pay this debt but at the present time it seems quite impossible."
