We wish to inform you that the sum of \$802.57 has been credited to the Estate of Masao Kashino, Deceased, being the amount distributed by the liquidator of the Green Cove Salteries Limited, to be applied on the claim of your late husband as a creditor of that Company. 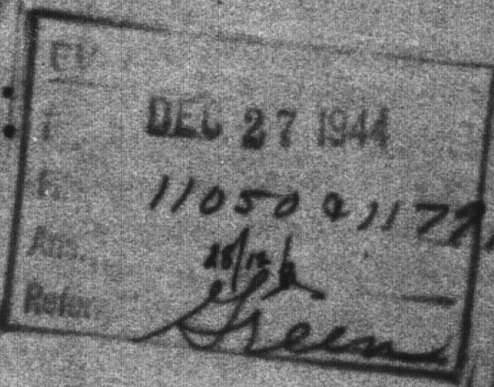

Dear Madam:-

We have received with regret the news of the death of your husband.

You will recall that when your former house at 2525 Oxford Street was sold to Mr. King, Mr. Hikida visited Vancouver. Under authority from Mr. Kashino he negotiated with Mr. King for the purchase of the electric stove and the shipment of the balance of your belongings. As funds were required for shipment, the writer agreed to the proceeds of sale of the stove being paid to Mr. Hikida.

We understand that the purchase price was \$275.00 of which \$75.00 was paid in cash and \$70.00 has since been received leaving a balance of \$130.00 which Mr. King is to remit to you.

We find, however, that there are considerable claims against your husband as per our letters of February 2nd to Mr. Kashino and November 28th to Mr. Hikida. We have not had any acknowledgement of these letters or comment on these claims and feel that for the time being we cannot permit Mr. King to make you any further remittances. We have, therefore, instructed Mr. King accordingly.

We should be glad if you or Mr. Hikida would advise us promptly as to whether you acknowledge these claims against your husband, and if so what plans you have to meet them. We fully appreciate that we are writing this at rather a difficult period for you but the writer was at fault in permitting the previous remittance from the sale of the stove to be made to you and we have, therefore, no option but to discontinue them at least for the time being.
