Re: Otoji KAMACHI, Registration No. 08614,
wife Yukie KAMACHI, Registration No. 12838.

In reply to your letter of July 12th, we wish to advise that the credit balance in the account of Otoji KAMACHI at this office is \$840.02 as stated. However, from March 24th to June 19th, 1944, his account held a credit balance of \$1165.02 which amount you state was mentioned in our letter to you of May 8th as being in Mrs. Yukie KAMACHI's account. Apparently there has been some mistake as Mrs. Kamachi has never had an account at this office, she owns no property and I find no indication of our letter to you of May 8th, according to our records.

May we hear further from you in reply to our letter of July 6th.
