In her JP form Mio Kanatsuka declared under date of July 3, 1942 that she had no chattels in the protected area of British Columbia. In further particulars of registration made by Shizuo Kanatsuka on behalf of her mother, Mio Kanatsuka, dated October 10, 1942 and attached to Mio Kanatsuka's JP form, a number of articles were declared to be at 838 West 7th Avenue, Vancouver. SUMMARY

Re: Mrs. Mio (Toyono) KANATSUKA

Although Mrs. Kanatsuka failed to declare any chattels in her declaration of July 3, 1942, on October 10, 1942, her daughter declared her mother failed to declare personal property and lists articles left in their home at 838 - West 8th Avenue, Vancouver, B.C. (See schedule). This declaration is attached to original one of July 3, 1942.

It is noted that she declared 35 boxes big and small which were never itemized by the Kanatsukas or by the Custodian. Goods of any value were removed and sold by auction (see schedule). In addition to the above articles, the file of Mrs. Tsune Nakamura (#12225) reveals she declared 3 boxes of cutlery, silverware and Japanese dishes in the home of Mrs. Kanatsuka. The Kanatsukas did not mention these boxes having been left with them. In a letter received from Mrs. Nakamura on February 13, 1946, she still maintains 3 boxes were left at this address. Miss Kanatsuka was written to on February 18, 1946 with reference to Mrs. Nakamura's statement and no reply was received. All goods removed were sold and credited to Mrs. Kanatsuka's account. It was impossible for this office to identify Mrs. Nakamura's goods, as we must assume her name did not appear on the tags. We are, therefore, forwarding all the funds to Mrs. Kanatsuka and are writing both parties interested they must come into some agreement among themselves.

Dear Madam:

With reference to your letter of February 15th, this matter was again referred to our Protection Department who informed us that no trace of any gramophone records was found in connection with the chattels removed from 838 West 7th Avenue, Vancouver, B.C. They confirm that a large quantity of goods was so badly damaged by dampness, etc., that it had to be destroyed or given away. The list sent to you of chattels sold by auction represented all the goods that had a salable value and if you go through these you will find that glassware, etc., is included.

You do not seem to realize that a detailed inventory of the goods left behind was not furnished by you and therefore it was impossible for any proper checking to be done. The greenhouse was of course sold as part of the house and included in the sale price. We have no record at all of the big wardrobe closet you mention.

We note your reference to Mr. Wilson but we would point out that in your signed statement of October 10th, 1942 you mentioned that the thirty-five boxes, etc., were left in the care of the new tenant, Mr. Wilson, and when he signed for these boxes, etc., he added "apparently here but cannot vouch for contents", thus indicating that he could not be held responsible for whatever goods were included in the packages. There is nothing further that we can do in this matter.

We await your reply to our letters of the 4th and 18th of February.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 13th of February respecting three boxes containing cutlery, dinnerware, Japanese dishes and silverware, which you stated were left at 838 - W. 7th Avenue, Vancouver, which property was owned by Mr. T. Kanatsuka. We would inform you that we are unable to trace on any of the Kanatsuka files relating to this property that they had in their charge three such boxes, but we have written them on this matter and when we hear from them we will advise you accordingly.

We would like to point out, however, that on July 30th, 1943 we wrote to you on the question of chattels but received no reply from you. It is true that we particularly referred to chattels declared by you at 874 W. 6th Avenue, but having received no reply from you we naturally assumed that nothing of value was left behind by you and our letter in question was so worded as to confirm this implication.

On going through your file we observe that there is a claim of \$2.00 against you by Komura Bros. for merchandise supplied - account being dated June 1, 1942. We would be glad to know if you admit this claim and if so we shall be pleased to receive your remittance that we may make payment.

Dear Madam:

We are in receipt of your letter of February 5th and in view of your remarks have discussed this matter with our Protection Department who handled the chattels which were left at 836 West 7th Avenue, Vancouver, B.C.

In the first place, we would point out that no detailed inventory of chattels was supplied by you and when the tenant, Mr. Wilson, in October 1942 signed for the goods which were declared by you on behalf of your mother, namely:

35 - boxes	1 - Sofa
3 - beds & springs	5 - tables 12- chairs

he made the following annotation "Apparently here but cannot vouch for contents - Frank Wilson".

You will recall that these chattels were stored by you in a section under the verandah and it was not considered that this was ideal storage by any means, the place being somewhat exposed and could not be guaranteed in wet weather. Our Protection Department report that in cases such as this, books and many other items of this nature, including blankets and clothing, are damaged by moisture and moths and thus become unsalable and have to be discarded. Quite a number of items, including an old couch, home-made tables, broken bed springs, etc., were condemned by the auctioneer as having no value. A final check is being made by our Protection Department to ascertain if any goods of a personal nature are still in our warehouse and as soon as this check is made you will be advised.

We find that the last two paragraphs of your letter of November 1st, 1945 have not been dealt with and we are now in receipt of your letter of January 28. In order that you, and your mother and father, may be clear as to the allocation of funds from the sale of real property, chattels, etc., we give below the amounts standing in your three accounts:

The balance, namely \$4.61, is the amount returned by A. S. Matthews & Co. in connection with the fire insurance policy on furniture. As this premium was paid by you the refund has been credited to your account.

Respecting the amount of \$64.60 credited to your account for the sale of the radio, it is necessary for us to have on file the radio receipt handed to you by the B. C. E. P. We shall be glad, therefore, if you will forward this to us as promptly as possible.

This letter is addressed to you as you have been writing on behalf of your parents, but an extra copy of this letter is attached which please pass on to Mr. and Mrs. Kanatuba, whom we observe are also resident at Tashiro, B. C.

If after going through this letter with your parents there is anything that is not clear, then please advise us by return when we will give the matter prompt attention.
