

CHATELS:

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on July 3/42 and was evacuated on Sept. 1/42, declared the following chattels at the Phoenix Cannery bunk house:

1 kitchen stove
porcelain dishware
cutlery

iron bed
spring and mattress

None of these chattels were found by the Custodian. We wrote to the above on April 28/45 and asked him if he had disposed of them prior to his evacuation. We received no reply to this letter so we must assume he did.

The file reveals that on Oct. 28/42 the account of the above was credited with the sum of \$151.75 received from the A.B.C. Packing Co. Ltd., Phoenix Cannery, for 4 nets and 1 anchor, which had been sold for the sum of \$278.00, from which they deducted the sum of \$126.25 owing to them by the above for his 1941 fishing account. These nets were sold by the Custodian but were not inventoried by us.

ARTICLES:

According to information supplied to this office the above was the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "M.N.", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$344.00, and this sum was paid to the above on July 4/42. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

In July, 1945, the account of the above was credited with the sum of \$1.92, being a refund from the B.C.E.A., security deposit for light.
